

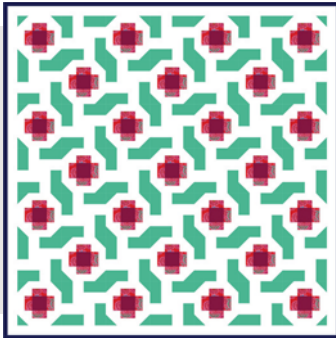

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Cover quilt is approximately 68" x 68".

Getting started

This pattern assumes that you have basic quilting knowledge. It does not provide directions for basic quilting techniques such as rotary cutting, sewing an accurate $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam, pressing, pinning, basting, quilting, or binding.

Materials

The only materials you need for this quilt are standard quilting supplies such as a sewing machine, thread, iron, marking pen or pencil, rotary cutter and rulers, and so on.

Fabric

You will need a variety of 100% cotton quilting fabrics, 42" wide, as listed in the table below.

Please note that the fabric requirements below are calculated and the amounts listed do not have much of a "fudge factor" built in; I recommend purchasing slightly more than listed to allow for mistakes and crooked cuts.

Try choose a solid or a non-busy print for your background so that the design shows up well. Also, when choosing your colorful accent fabrics, make sure that they contrast well with the background fabric.

There are coloring sheets towards the end of this pattern (pages 11 to 14)—feel free to use any color combination you love!

The fabrics used in the cover quilt are:

- A:** Kona PFD
- B:** Kona Breakers
- C:** Kona Berry
- D:** Assorted red, magenta, and orange Kaffe Fassett prints

*Binding amount assumes 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips, cut the width of fabric. You will need additional fabric if you choose to cut your fabric on the bias.

Cutting

All measurements include $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowances.

Refer to the cutting diagrams at the end of this pattern to help you make efficient cuts from your A and B fabrics. Diagrams for the Crib and Throw are on page 15, and the Twin and Queen are on page 16.

Cutting instructions are not included for the C and scrappy D fabrics because there is only one cut size. For these you just need to cut width of fabric (WOF) strips and then cross-cut these strips into the size listed below.

Cut out your fabric as listed in the table below. The "Number" column lists how many pieces to cut out for each size. The "Block" column indicates whether the pieces are for block X or Y in the next section, or for the outer border at the end. The border strips will need to be pieced together to make long enough pieces.

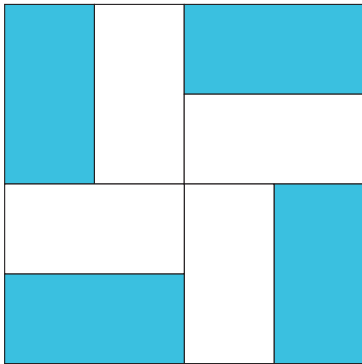

Sewing your blocks

All seam allowances are $\frac{1}{4}$ ". Blocks are 9" finished.

There are two different blocks in this quilt, Block X and Block Y. For both blocks, press your seams to the darker fabric or open.

Sew X blocks

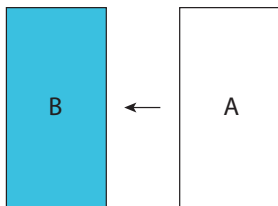


The instructions below are for one X block. You need to make this many for each size:

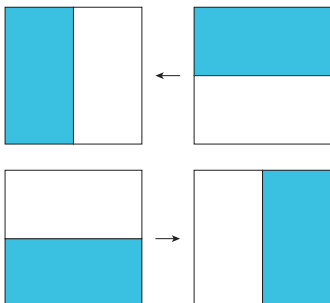
- Crib: 8
- Throw: 24
- Twin: 31
- Queen: 50

Sew your X blocks:

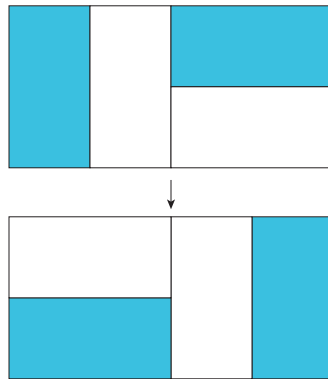
- 1** Sew one $2\frac{3}{4}$ " x 5" A rectangle to a $2\frac{3}{4}$ " x 5" B rectangle. Repeat three more times.



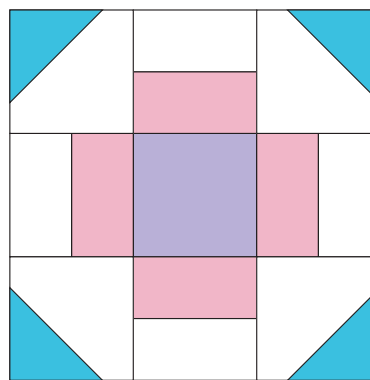
- 2** Sew the components from step 1 together into pairs, noting the orientation in the illustration below.



- 3** Sew the two components from step 2 together as illustrated below.



Sew Y blocks

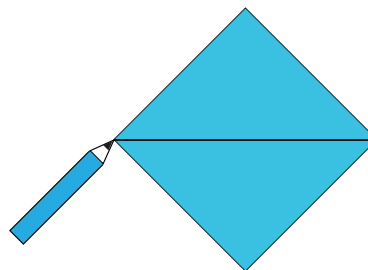


The instructions below are for one Y block. You need to make this many for each size:

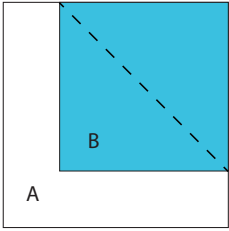
- Crib: 8
- Throw: 25
- Twin: 32
- Queen: 50

Sew your Y blocks:

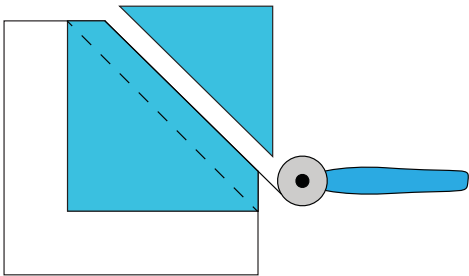
- 1** Mark a diagonal line on the back of your $2\frac{3}{4}$ " B squares.



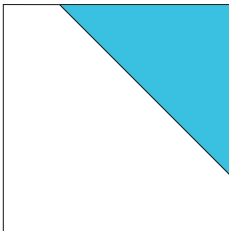
2 Place one $2\frac{3}{4}$ " B square in the corner of a $3\frac{1}{2}$ " A square, with right sides together. Sew across the marked line.



3 Trim away the extra triangle from the corner approximately $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from the seam you just sewed. Save these "bonus triangles" for another project or for the quilt back.

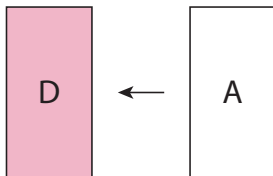


4 Press the B fabric up.

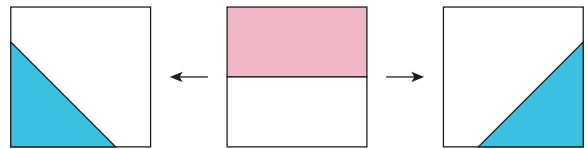
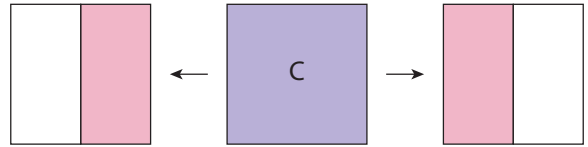
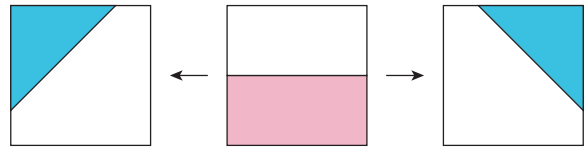


5 Repeat steps 1 through 4 three more times so that you have four of these components.

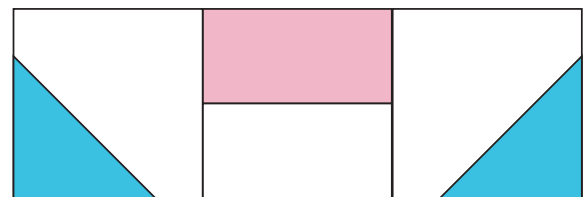
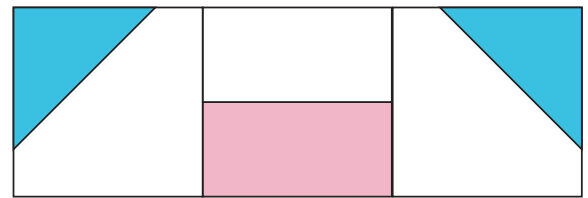
6 Sew one 2 " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " A rectangle to a 2 " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " D rectangle. Repeat three more times.



7 Lay out the block as illustrated below, and sew the components together into rows.



8 Sew the rows from step 7 together to finish your block.



Assembling your quilt top

Sew the rest of your quilt top together following the appropriate assembly diagram found on pages 7-10.

Quilting & Finishing

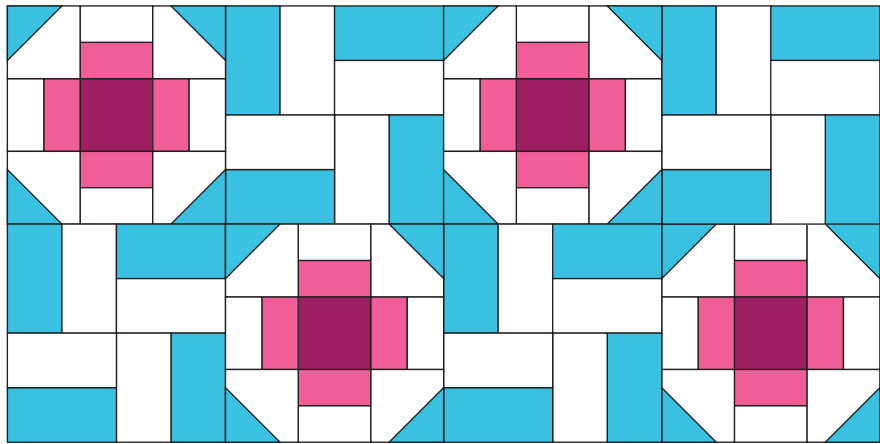
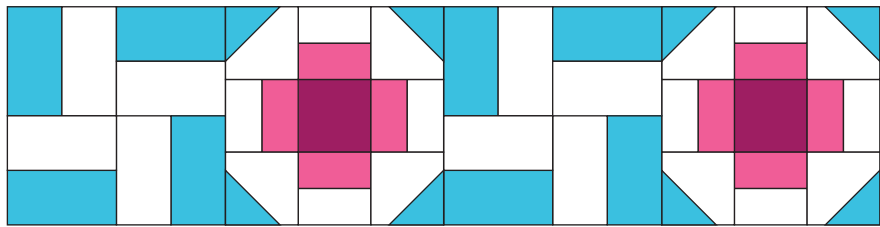
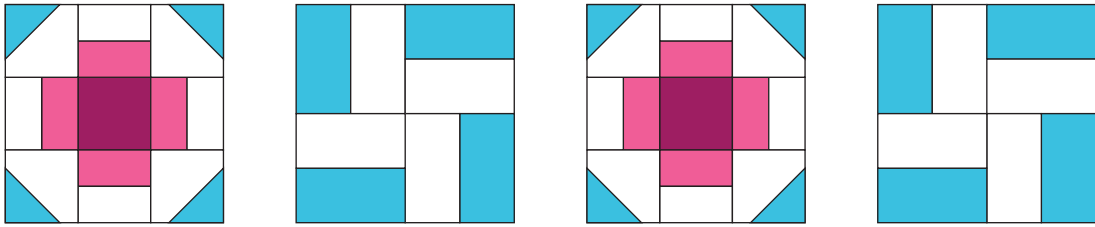
When you are done sewing the quilt top, press it well from both sides.

Layer your well-pressed quilt top with your batting and backing and baste your quilt.

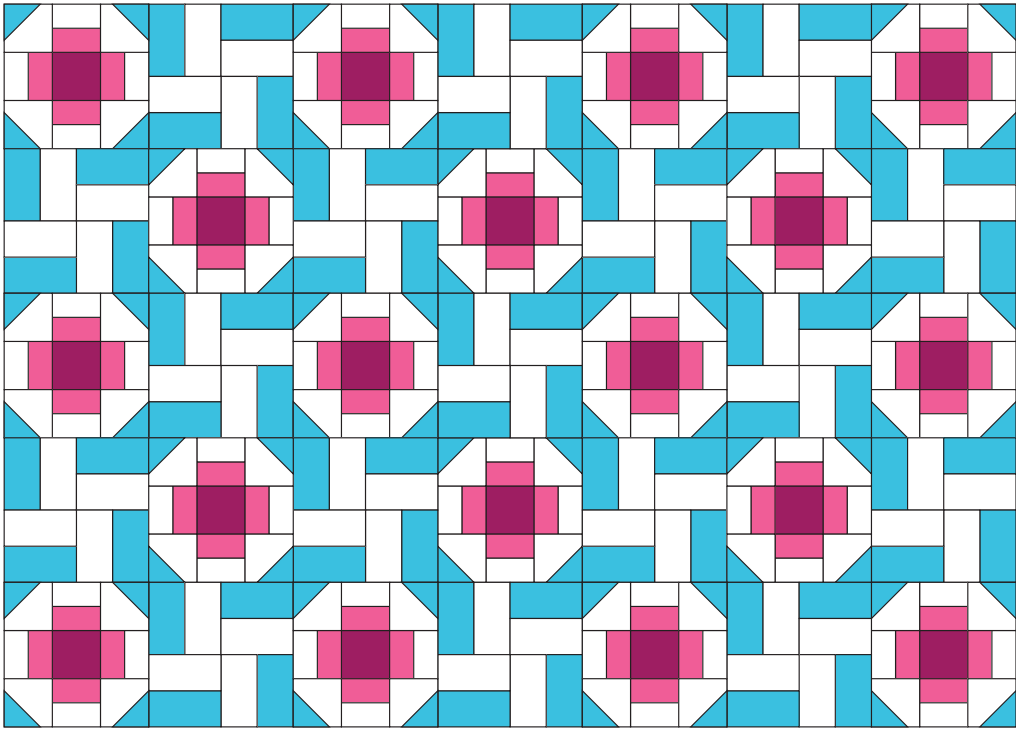
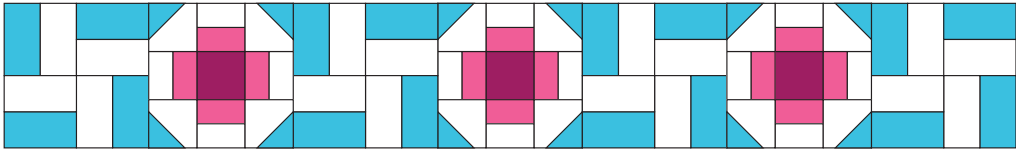
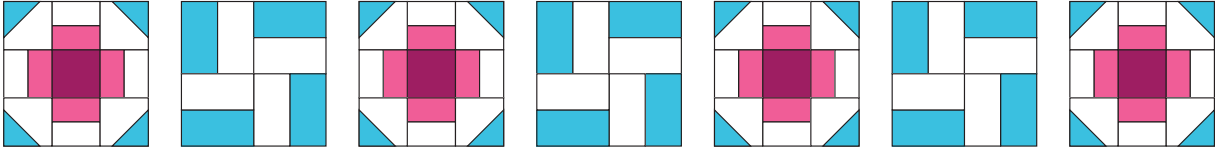
Quilt it with whatever pattern you find pleasing. I quilted mine with a medium-sized meander using a 40 weight variegated King Tut thread. If you prefer for your quilting thread to not stand out, I find that by using a very thin thread like Aurifil 50 weight, when the quilt is washed you can barely see the quilting, even on the dark colors. If you used linen or shot cottons in your quilt, keep your quilting somewhat dense as both of these fabrics have a tendency to fray.

After you have quilted your quilt, square it off so the edges are nice and straight, and then sew on your binding. Wash and enjoy!

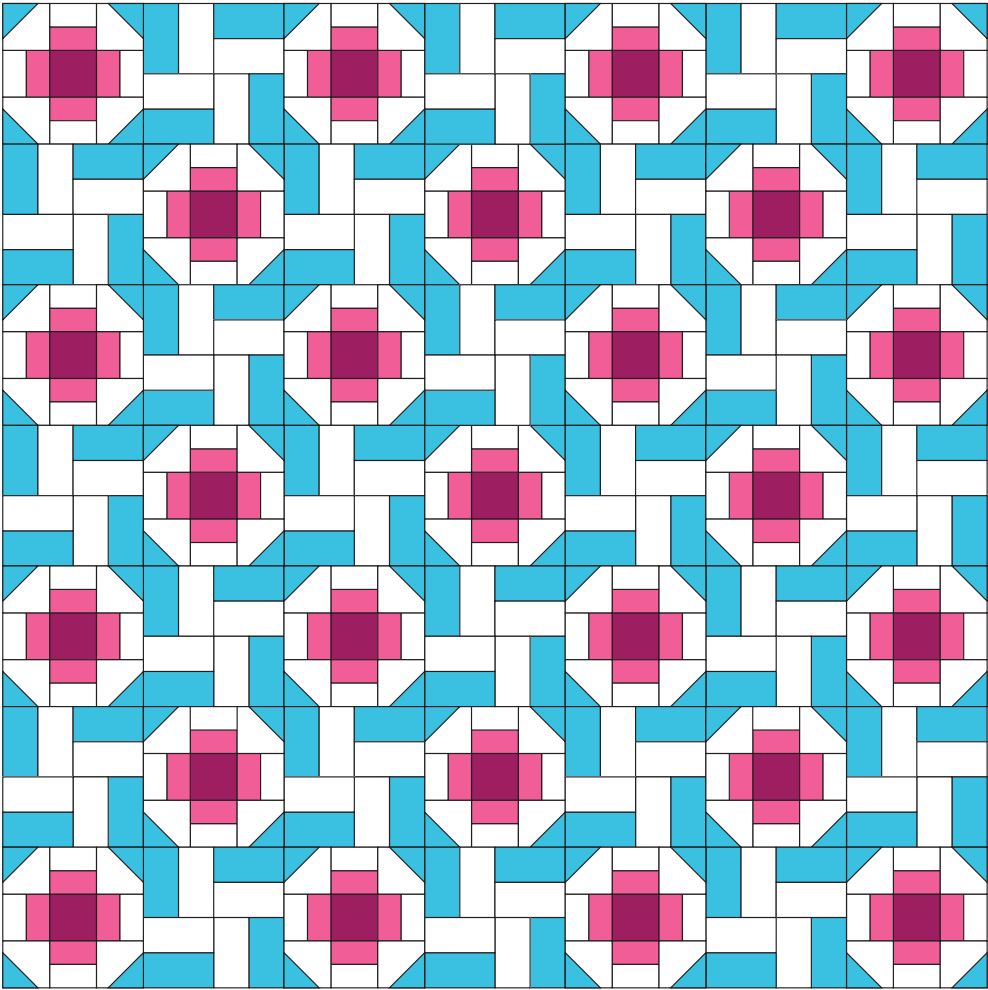
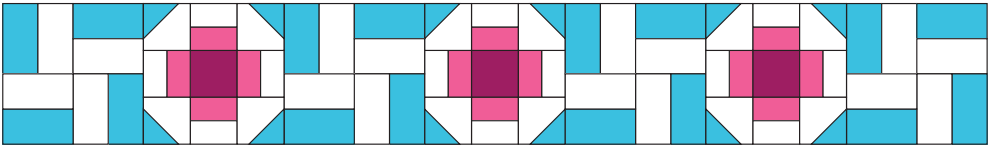
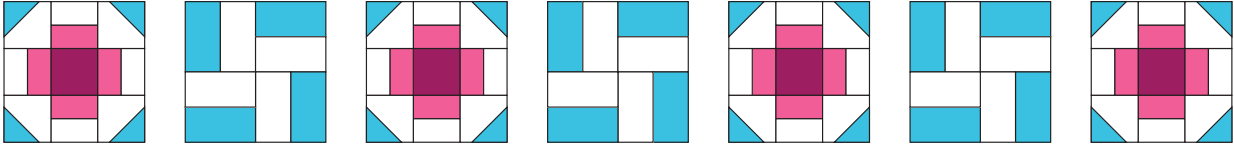
Final assembly: Crib



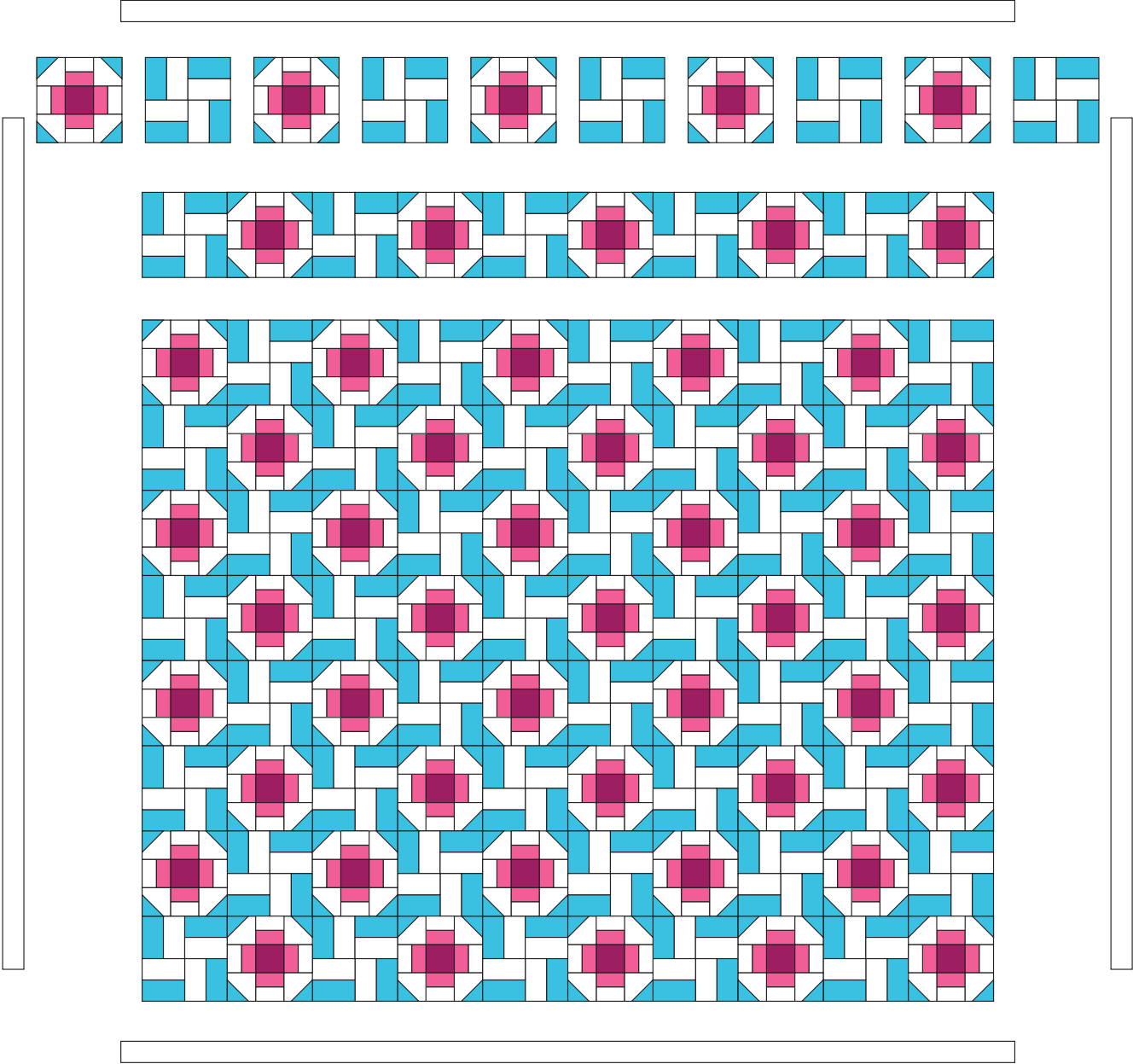
Final assembly: Throw



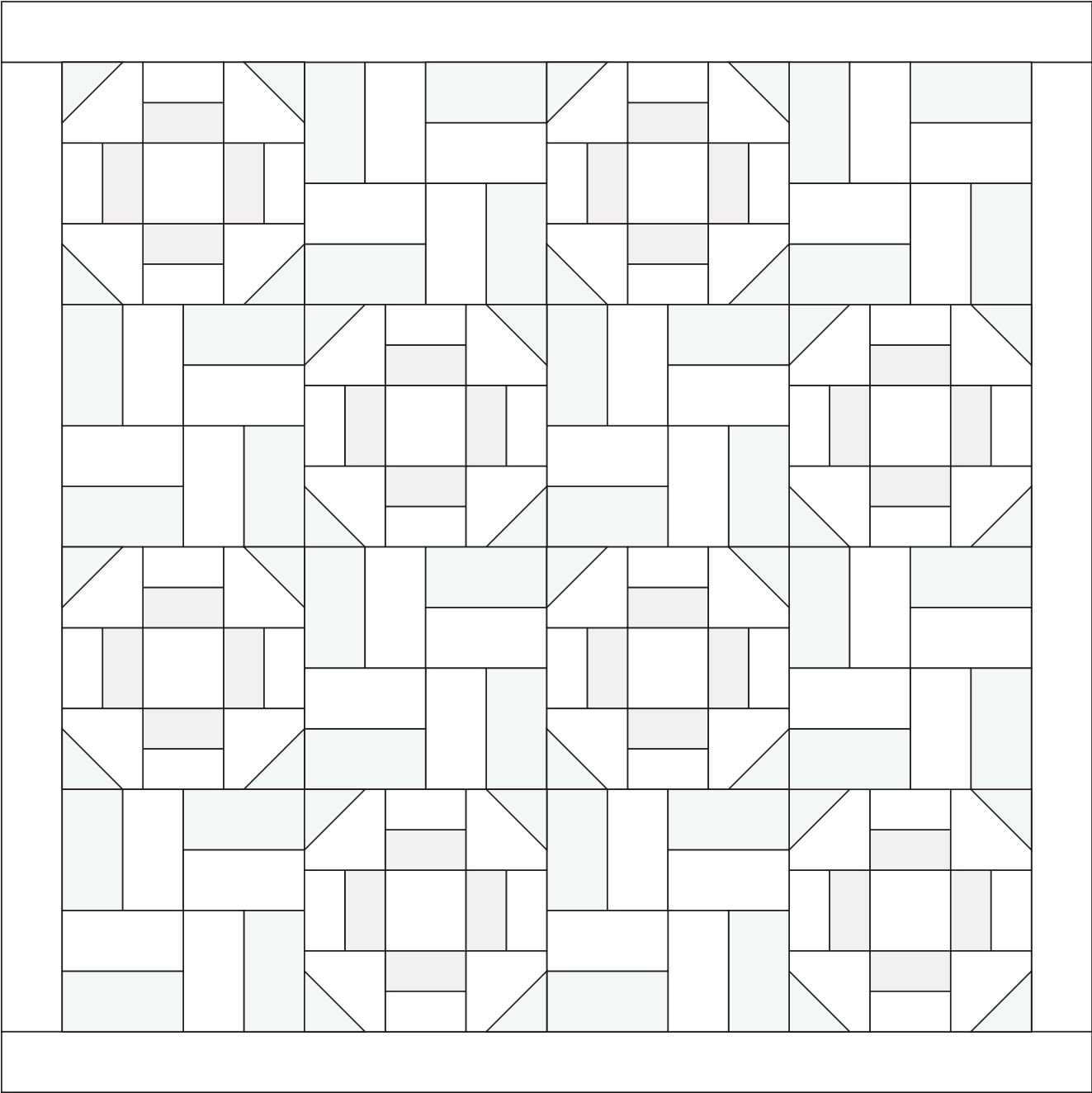
Final assembly: Twin



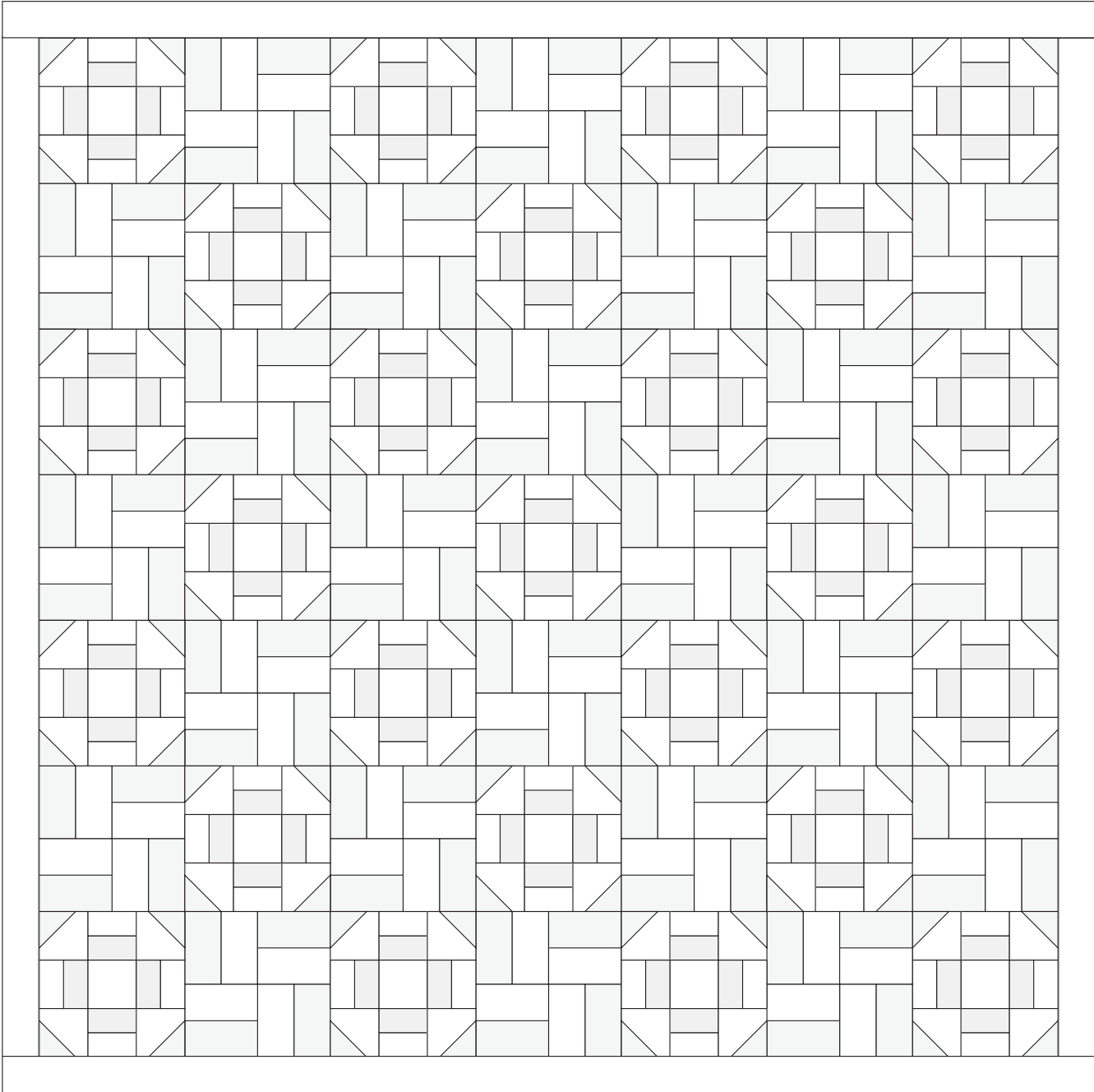
Final assembly: Queen



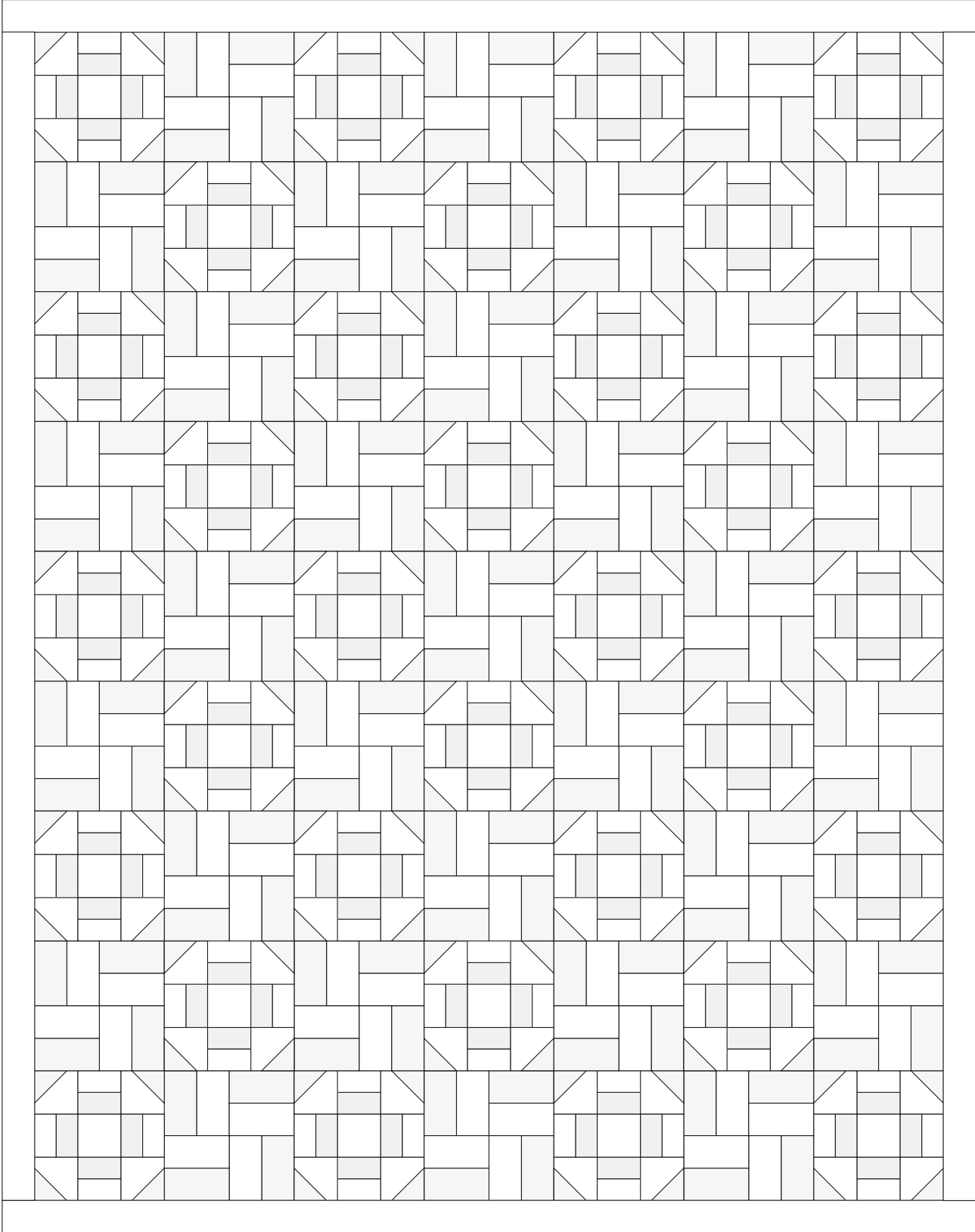

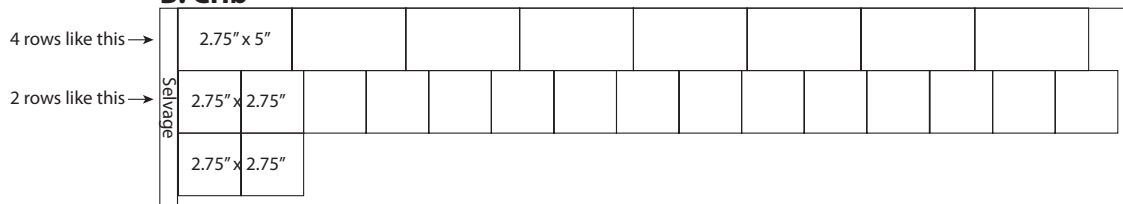


Cutting diagram: Crib (top) and Throw (bottom)

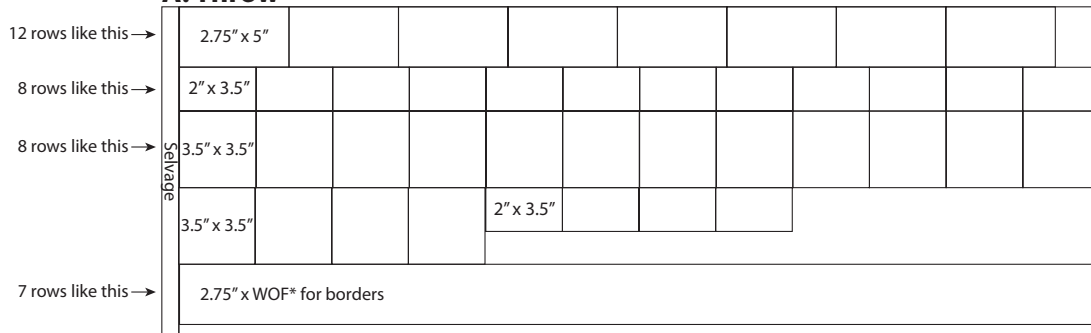

Cutting diagram: Twin (top) and Queen (bottom)

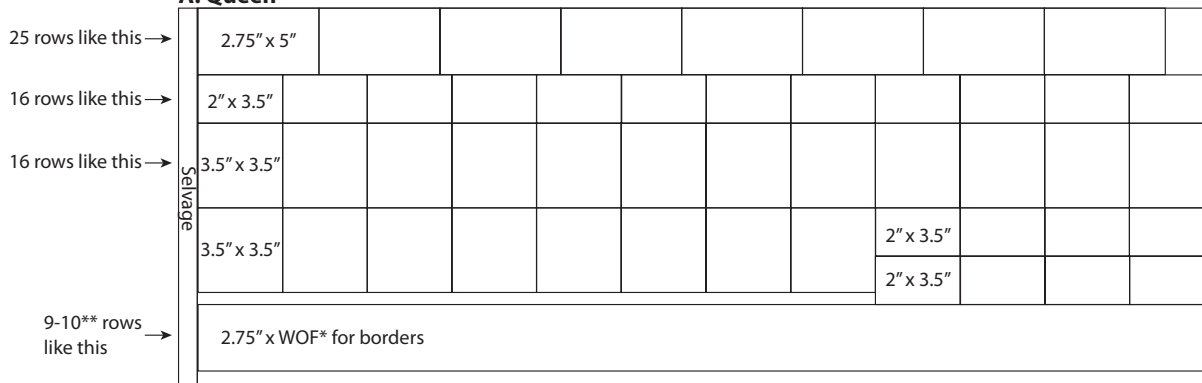

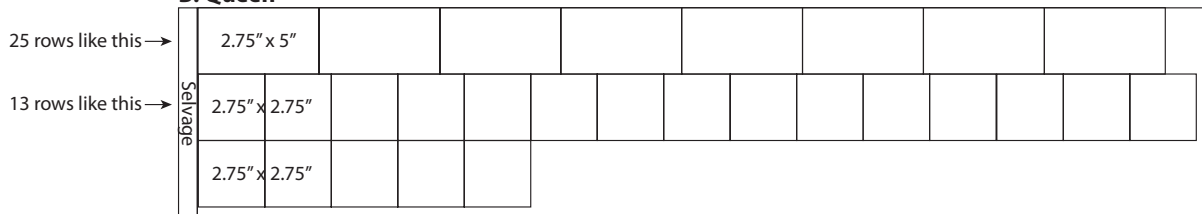
