Cutting

All measurements include $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowances.

Cut out your fabric as listed in the tables below. Refer to the cutting diagrams for the background and post fabrics to help you make efficient cuts from your fabric.

Download and print a free coloring sheet at goo.gl/KTSVF1.

The quilt layout is made up of whole and half rings. The cutting directions below assume that you will make one whole ring or two half rings out of each print. You can also make each of the half rings different if you prefer.

Crib

Number of rings 9
(7 whole, 4 half)

A (prints)
For **each** of 9
rings, cut (4) $5\frac{1}{2}$ " squares
(1) 3" square

B (background) (2) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x 38"
(20) $5\frac{1}{2}$ " x 3"
(72) 3" squares

C (posts) (7) 3 " x $10\frac{1}{2}$ "
(2) 3 " x 8 "
(3) 3 " squares

Throw

Number of rings 25
(22 whole, 6 half)

A (prints)
For **each** of 25
rings, cut (4) $5\frac{1}{2}$ " squares
(1) 3" square

B (background) (2) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x 63" *
(54) $5\frac{1}{2}$ " x 3"
(200) 3" squares

C (posts) (22) 3 " x $10\frac{1}{2}$ "
(3) 3 " x 8 "
(5) 3 " squares

Twin

Number of rings 35
(32 whole, 6 half)

A (prints)
For **each** of 35
rings, cut (4) $5\frac{1}{2}$ " squares
(1) 3" square

B (background) (2) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x 88" *
(74) $5\frac{1}{2}$ " x 3"
(280) 3" squares

C (posts) (32) 3 " x $10\frac{1}{2}$ "
(3) 3 " x 8 "
(5) 3 " squares

Queen

Number of rings 49
(45 whole, 8 half)

A (prints)
For **each** of 49
rings, cut (4) $5\frac{1}{2}$ " squares
(1) 3" square

B (background) (2) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x 88" *
(104) $5\frac{1}{2}$ " x 3"
(392) 3" squares

C (posts) (45) 3 " x $10\frac{1}{2}$ "
(4) 3 " x 8 "
(7) 3 " squares

*These borders will need to be pieced together from two or more WOF (width of fabric) strips.

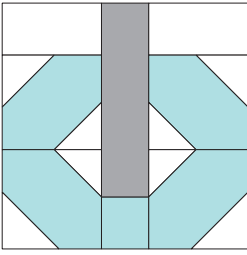
Sewing your blocks

All seam allowances are $\frac{1}{4}$ ".

This quilt has four different blocks: Ring, Top half, Bottom half, and End blocks.

After each step, press your seams in the direction of the arrows, towards the darker side, or open, whichever you prefer.

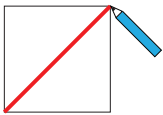
Sew your Ring blocks



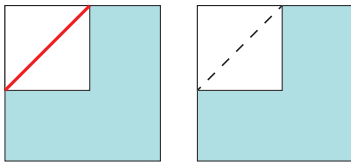
Ring blocks are 12½" square finished/13" unfinished. You need:

- 7 blocks for the Crib,
- 22 for the Throw,
- 32 for the Twin, and
- 45 for the Queen.

- 1** Mark a diagonal line on the back of each 3" B square with a water-soluble marker. You will use most for this block and some for the other blocks.

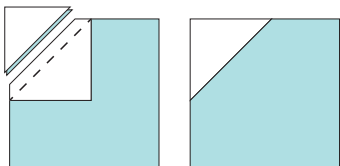


- 2** Place one of the marked 3" B squares in the corner of a 5½" A square, right sides together, noting the orientation of the diagonal line in the illustration below. Sew across the pair on the diagonal line.

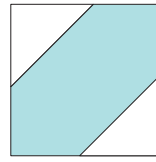


- 3** Trim the extra triangle off of the corner, about ¼" from the seam you just sewed. (These "bonus triangles" are not used in the quilt. You can use them in your backing or in another project.)

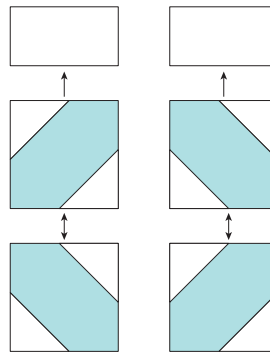
Press the corner out.



- 4** Repeat this process for the opposite corner. Make 4 of these in the same print for each Ring block.



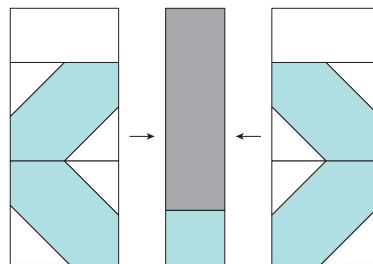
- 5** Sew the four components from step 4 into pairs as illustrated below. Sew a 5½" x 3" B rectangle to the top of each pair.



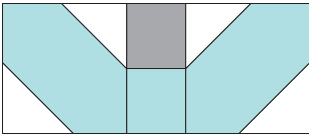
- 6** Sew a 3" A square to a 3" x 10½" C rectangle.



- 7** Sew the two components from step 5 to either side of the component from step 6 as illustrated below.



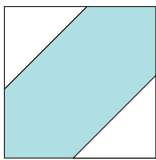
Sew your Top half blocks



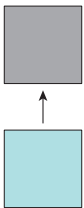
The Top half blocks are 13" wide x 5½" high (unfinished) You need:

- 2 blocks for the Crib,
- 3 for the Throw,
- 3 for the Twin, and
- 4 for the Queen.

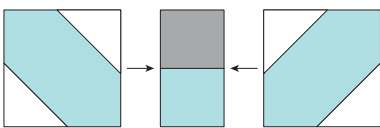
- 1** For each top half block, make two matching components as described in steps 1 to 4 in the *Sew your Ring blocks* section.



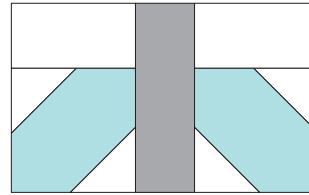
- 2** Sew one 3" A square to a 3" C square.



- 3** Sew the two components from step 1 to either side of the component from step 2, noting the orientation below.



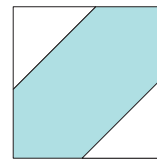
Sew your Bottom half blocks



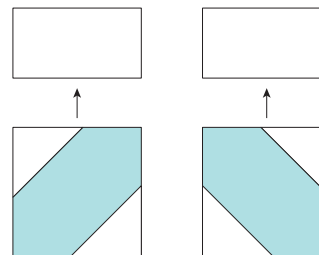
The Bottom half blocks are 13" wide x 8" high (unfinished) You need:

- 2 blocks for the Crib,
- 3 for the Throw,
- 3 for the Twin, and
- 4 for the Queen.

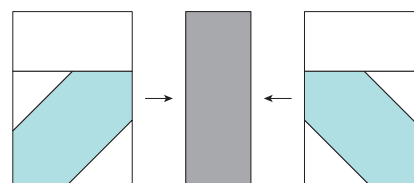
- 1** For each Bottom half block, make two matching components as described in steps 1 to 4 in the *Sew your Ring blocks* section.



- 2** Sew a 5½" x 3" B rectangle to the top each of the components from step 1, noting the orientation below.



- 3** Sew the two components from step 2 to either side of a 3" x 8" C rectangle.



Sew your End blocks



The End blocks are 13" wide x 3" high (unfinished) You need:

- 1 block for the Crib,
- 2 blocks for the Throw,
- 2 for the Twin, and
- 3 for the Queen.

Sew one 3" x 5½" B rectangle to either side of a 3" C square.



Assembling your quilt top

Sew the rest of your quilt top together following the assembly diagram. Note that ***the columns of blocks do not line up with each other at the top and bottom***. Instead, center the ring blocks in the gap between rings in adjacent rows as shown in the assembly diagram. After sewing the columns together, trim the extra length from the longer columns even with the top edge of the adjacent columns.

Quilting & finishing

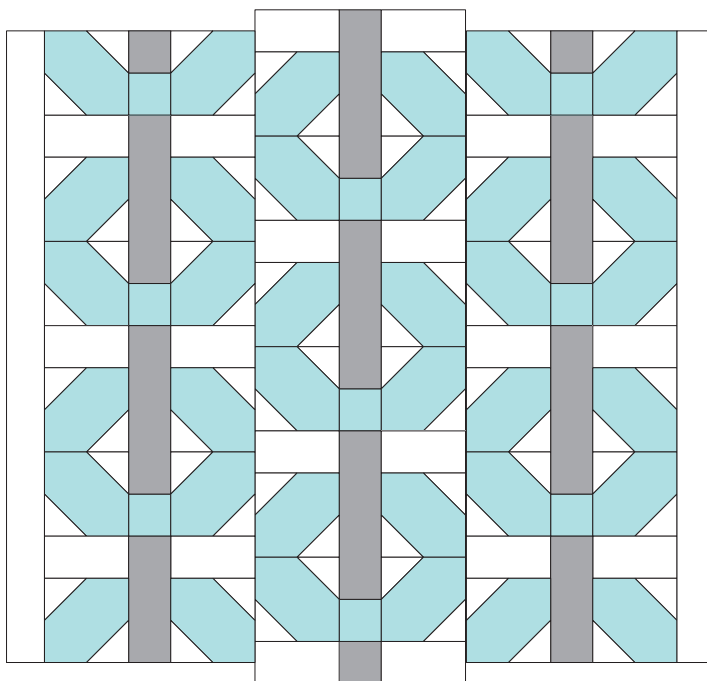
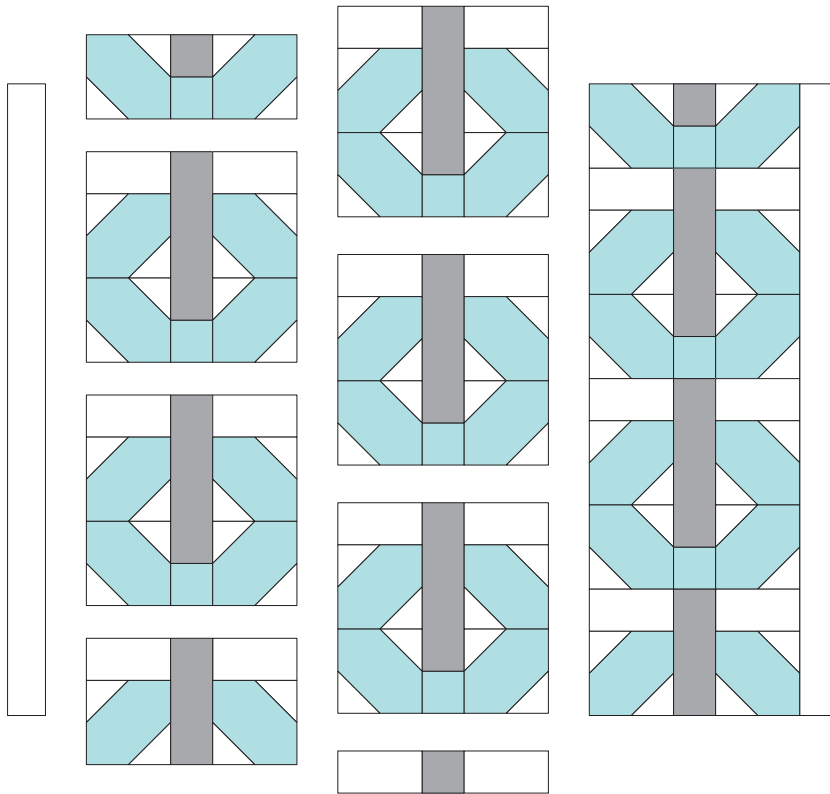
When you are done the quilt top, press it well from both sides.

Layer your well-pressed quilt top with your batting and backing and baste your quilt.

Quilt it, square it off so the edges are nice and straight, and then sew on your binding. Wash and enjoy!

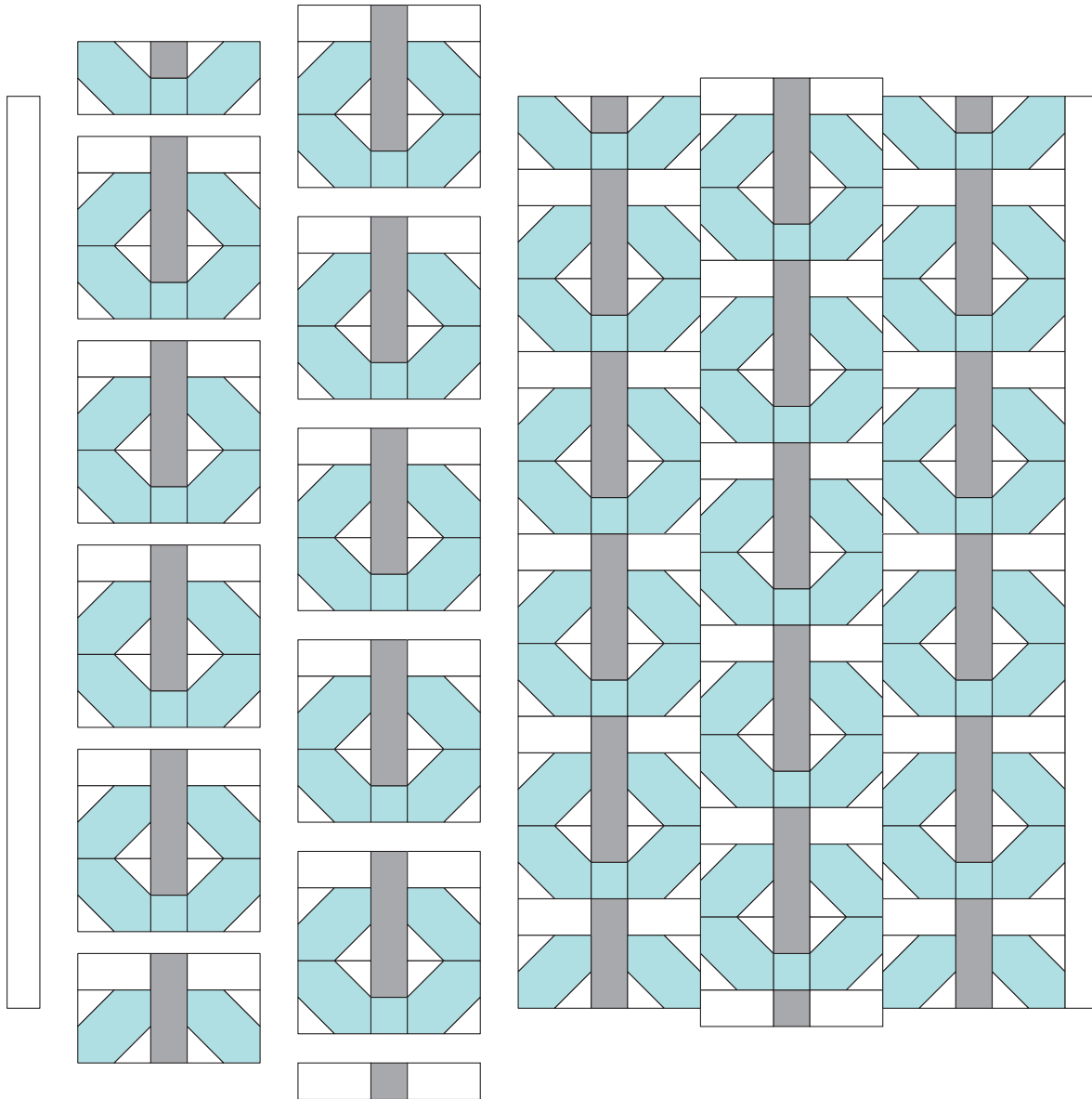
Assembly: Crib

Sew your blocks together into columns, and then sew the columns together as shown below. Note that **the columns do not line up at the top and bottom** (this is easier to see in the bottom illustration). Instead, center the ring blocks in the gap between rings in adjacent rows. Add the two side borders. Press as you wish. Trim off the extra length from the longer columns so that they're even with the top edge of the adjacent columns.



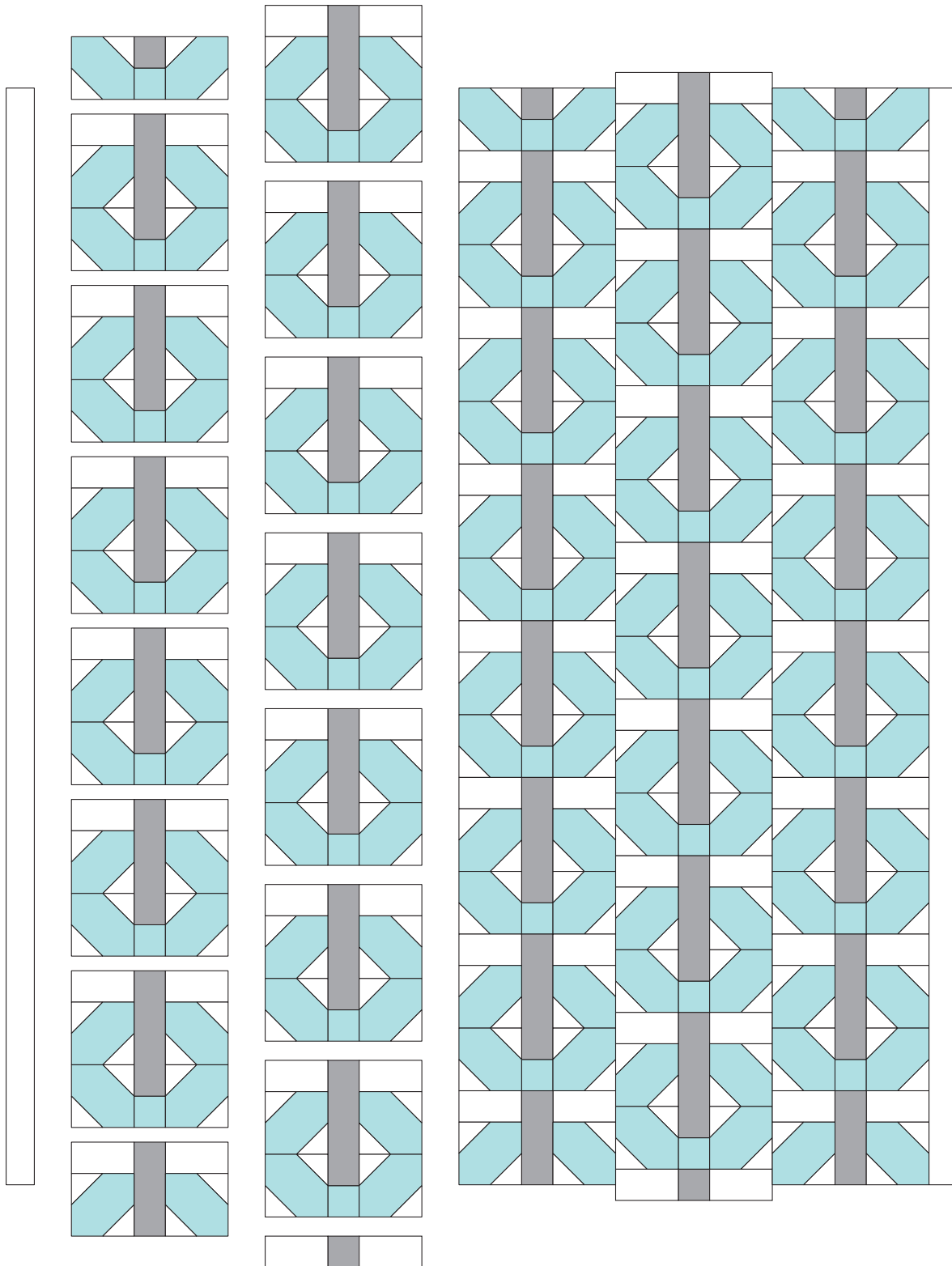
Assembly: Throw

Sew your blocks together into columns, and then sew the columns together as shown below. Note that **the columns do not line up at the top and bottom**. Instead, center the ring blocks in the gap between rings in adjacent rows. Add the two side borders. Press as you wish. Trim off the extra length from the longer columns so that they're even with the top edge of the adjacent columns.



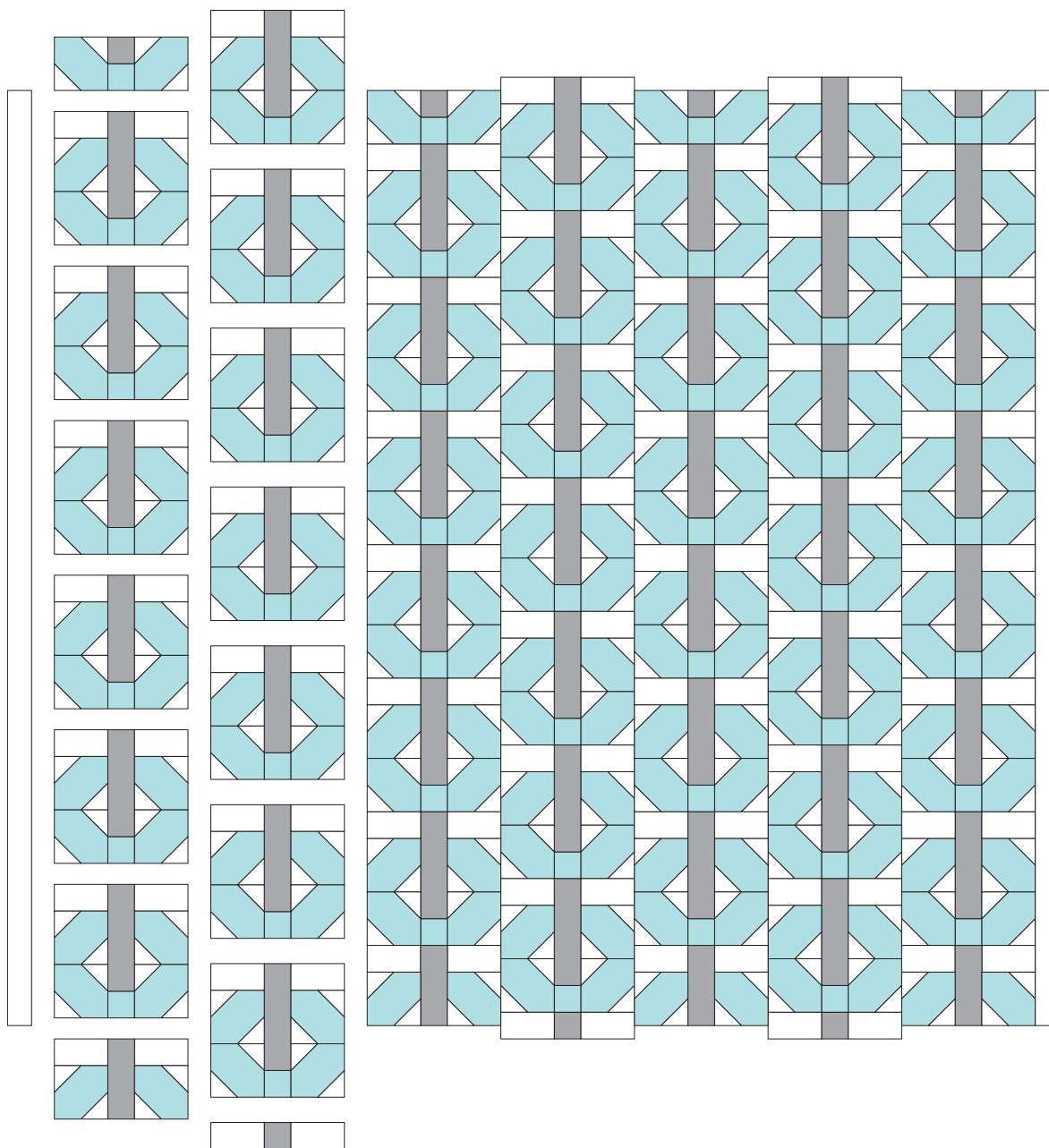
Assembly: Twin

Sew your blocks together into columns, and then sew the columns together as shown below. Note that **the columns do not line up at the top and bottom**. Trim off the extra length from the longer columns so that they're even with the top edge of the adjacent columns.



Assembly: Queen

Sew your blocks together into columns, and then sew the columns together as shown below. Note that **the columns do not line up at the top and bottom**. Instead, center the ring blocks in the gap between rings in adjacent rows. Add the two side borders. Press as you wish. Trim off the extra length from the longer columns so that they're even with the top edge of the adjacent columns.

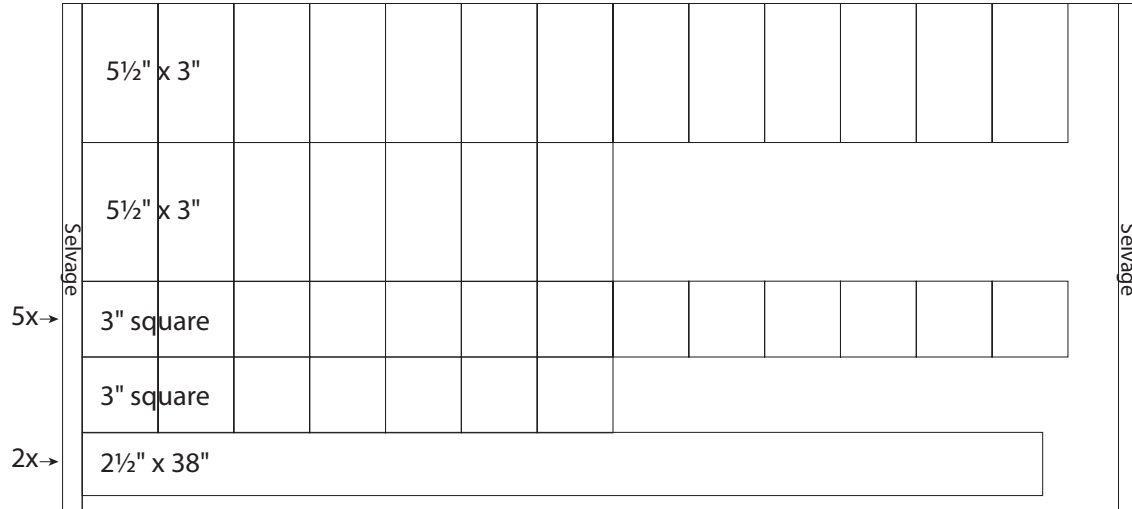


Cutting diagrams: Crib and Throw

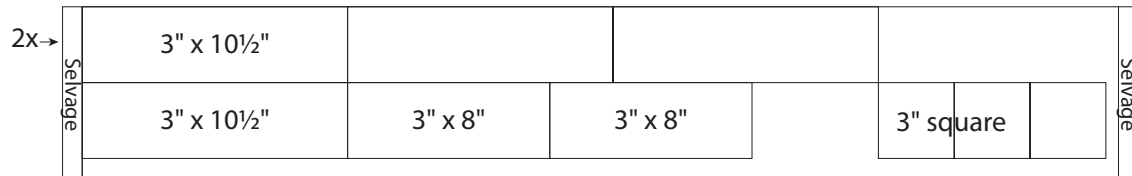
Use the following diagrams to cut your fabric. Some rows need to be cut multiple times. For example: 3x means to cut three of that row.

B: Background

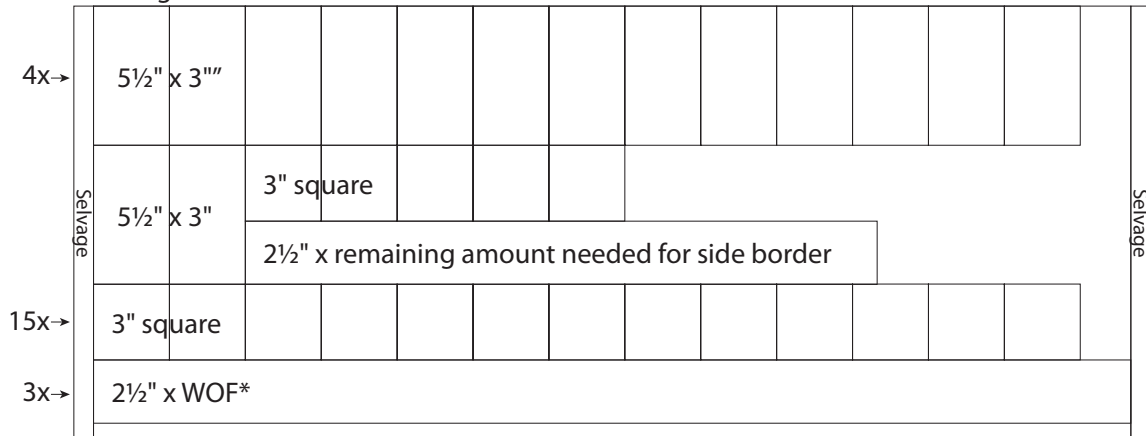


C: Posts

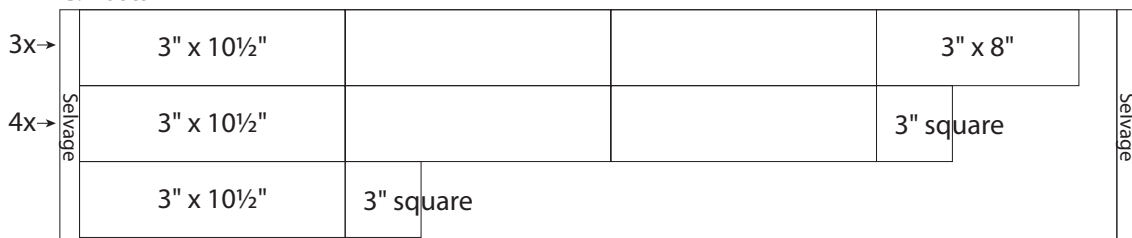

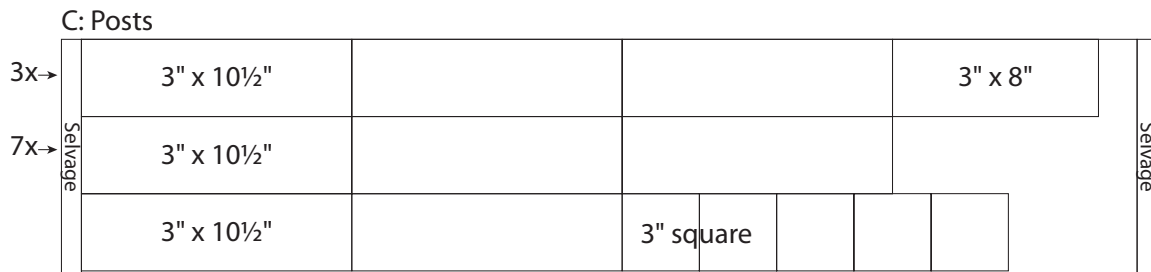

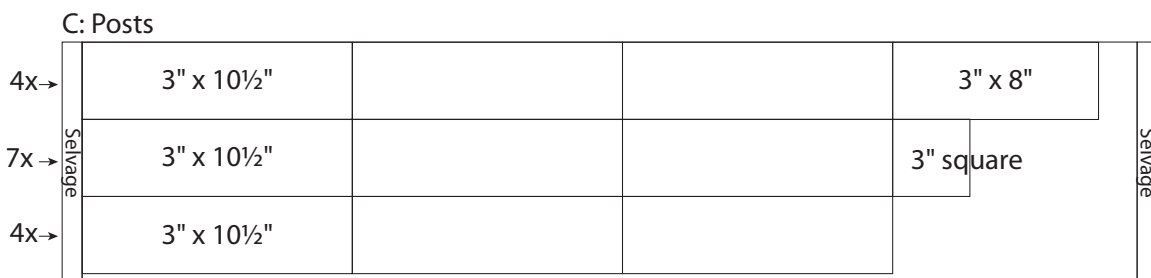
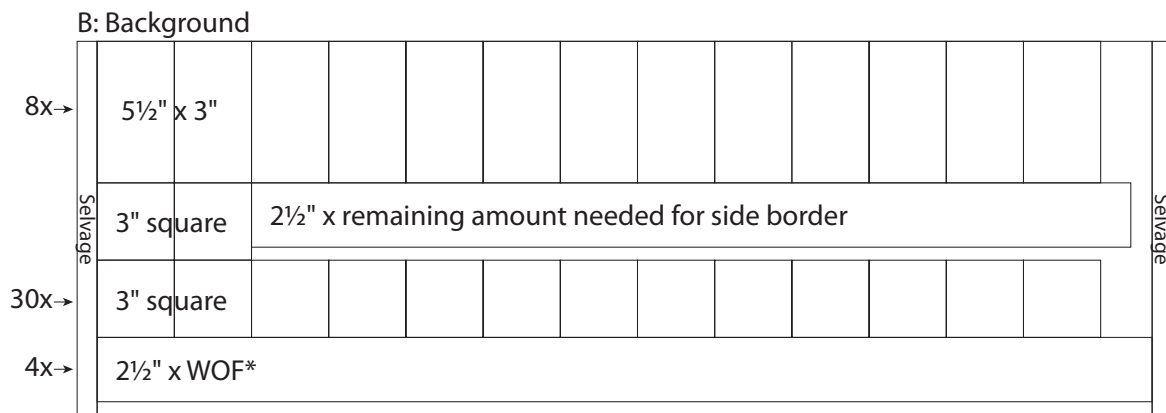

Fabric

You will need a variety of 100% cotton quilting fabrics, 42" wide, as listed in the table below. I recommend purchasing slightly more than listed just in case.

Choose a solid or a non-busy print for your background that contrasts well with your ring fabrics. The solid fabrics used in the cover quilt are Kona cottons. The white is PFD, and the light gray is Mushroom.

B (background)	1¼ yards	2½ yards	3½ yards	4½ yards
C (gray posts)	½ yard	1 yard	1¼ yards	1¾ yards
Binding***	½ yard	⅔ yard	⅔ yard	¾ yard
Backing	1½ yards	4¼ yards	5½ yards	8½ yards
Batting	46" x 42"	71" x 67"	71" x 92"	96" x 92"

* A full sized Fat eighth is either 9" x 22" or 11" x 18", either works. If they are smaller than this or have shrunk due to pre-washing, you will need a larger piece of fabric. A ⅓ yard cut will not work.

**If you would like a larger queen, you can add a border using either the white or light gray fabric. If you do enlarge the quilt, you will need extra batting, binding, and backing fabric.

***Binding amount assumes 2½" strips, cut the width of the fabric. You will need additional fabric if you choose to cut your fabric on the bias.



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
