# Cutting

All measurements include  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowances.

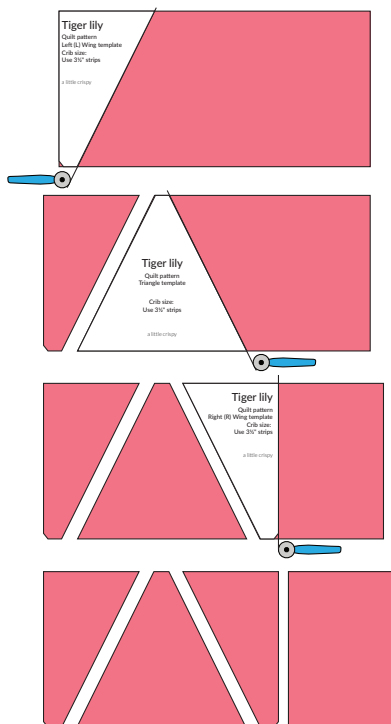
Fabric quantities are given on the back cover of this pattern.

Download and print a free coloring sheet at <https://goo.gl/azh4Y5>.

Cut out your fabric as listed in the appropriate table. The number of pieces to cut is in parentheses. Refer to the cutting diagrams at the back of this pattern for efficient Background fabric use.

For the WOF (width of fabric) strips I recommend using the Tri-Recs set of rulers (by EZ Quilting) to cut out the triangle and wing pieces. Alternatively, you can use a template (given on the **Template** insert). Note that there are two wing pieces, Right (R) and Left (L) that are mirror images.

Cut out the pieces in sets of two wings and one triangle as shown below. Make sure to cut the tiny notch off of the point of the wing pieces as those are used to align your pieces for sewing.



## Crib

Prints (56) 4" squares  
(16)  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " squares  
(3)  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips:  
subcut into 20 triangles,  
20 R and 20 L wings.  
You need 5" for each 2  
wing + triangle set.

Back-ground (56) 4" squares  
(28)  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " squares  
(5)  $9\frac{1}{2}$ " squares  
(3)  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips:  
subcut into (20) triangles,  
20 R and 20 L wings.

## Throw

Prints (56) 5" squares  
(16)  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " squares  
(4)  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips:  
subcut into 20 triangles,  
20 R and 20 L wings.  
You need 6" for each 2  
wing + triangle set.

Back-ground (56) 5" squares  
(28)  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " squares  
(5)  $12\frac{1}{2}$ " squares  
(4)  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips:  
subcut into (20) triangles,  
20 R and 20 L wings.

## Queen

Prints (56) 7" squares  
(16)  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " squares  
(5)  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips:  
subcut into 20 triangles,  
20 R and 20 L wings.  
You need 9" for each 2  
wing + triangle set.

Back-ground (56) 7" squares  
(28)  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " squares  
(5)  $18\frac{1}{2}$ " squares  
(5)  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips:  
subcut into (20) triangles,  
20 R and 20 L wings.

# Sewing your blocks

All seam allowances are  $\frac{1}{4}$ ".

Block sizes are 9" finished (Crib), 12" finished (Throw), and 18" finished (Queen). All three quilts have the same layout but different block sizes.

This quilt consists of four different blocks, A through D. First, you'll assemble all of the smaller components, and then you'll sew your blocks.

For all directions, the sizes are given in the format Crib (Throw)(Queen).

## Sew your components

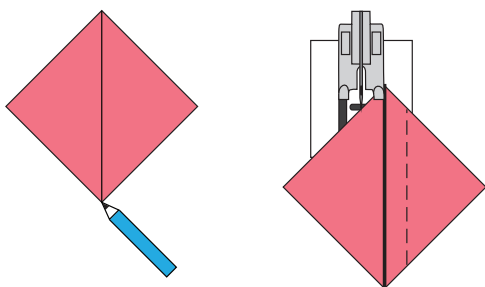
In this quilt there are two kinds of components: half-square triangle (HST) and triangle in a square (TiS) components. You'll make all of the components first and then randomize them when you sew your blocks together.

### Make your HSTs

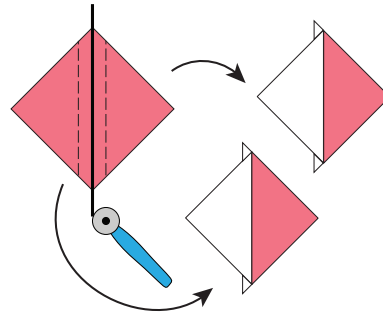
You will need 112 HSTs for all sizes.

- 1 Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on all of the wrong sides of either the Print or Background 4" (5")(7") squares, whichever is lighter in color.

Pair up Print and Background 4" (5")(7") squares and place them right sides together. Sew  $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from either side of the diagonal line.



- 2 Cut the squares in half on the marked line to create two HSTs. Press to the side or open.

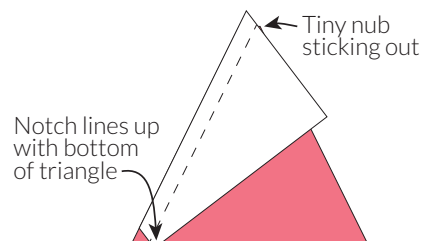


### Make your TiSs

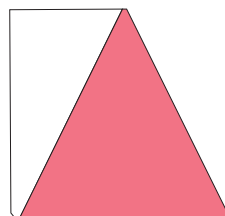
There are two kinds of TiSs in this quilt: a Print triangle with Background wings (X) and a Background triangle with Print wings (Y). You'll need 20 of each for all sizes.

- 1 For both types of TiSs, sew a wing to one side of the center triangle and press outward or open.

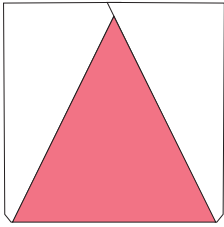
When you sew a wing piece to a triangle piece, place the pieces right sides together and line the wing up so that the little notch is lined up with the bottom edge of the triangle. There should be a very tiny nub of the triangle peeking out from behind the wing at the top as shown below.



- 2 Press the triangle out.

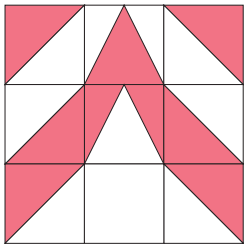


- 3** Repeat on the other side for the other wing piece.



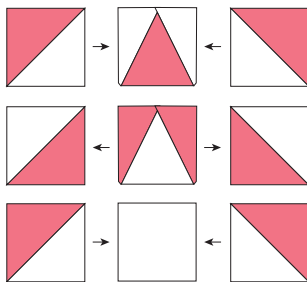
### Sew your A blocks

You need 16 A blocks for all sizes.

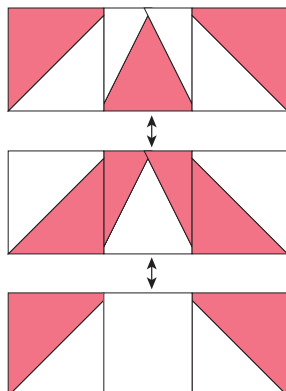


Each A block consists of 6 HSTs, one each of X and Y TiSs, and one  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " ( $4\frac{1}{2}$ " ( $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Background square.

- 1** Lay out your components as illustrated below and sew them into rows. Arrows below indicate pressing direction.

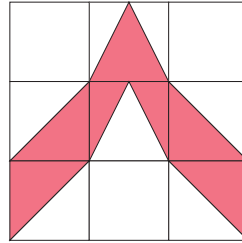


- 2** Sew the rows together and press.



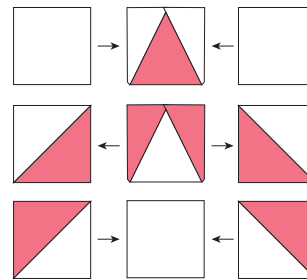
### Sew your B blocks

You need 4 B blocks for all sizes.

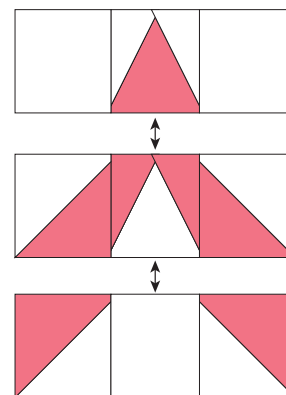


Each B block consists of 4 HSTs, 1 each of X and Y TiSs, and three  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " ( $4\frac{1}{2}$ " ( $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Background squares.

- 1** Lay out your components as illustrated below and sew them into rows. Arrows below indicate pressing direction.

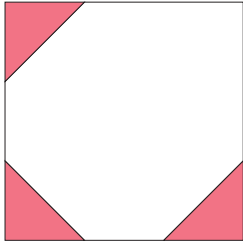


- 2** Sew the rows together and press open.



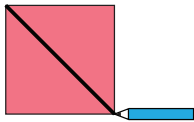
## Sew your C blocks

You need 4 C blocks for all sizes.



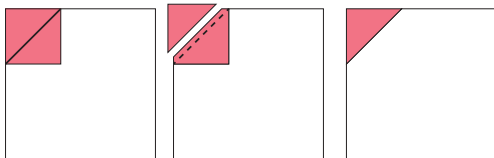
For each C block you'll need one  $9\frac{1}{2}$ " ( $12\frac{1}{2}$ ")( $18\frac{1}{2}$ " Background square and three  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " ( $4\frac{1}{2}$ ")( $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Print squares.

- 1 Mark a diagonal line on the back of each  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " ( $4\frac{1}{2}$ ")( $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Print square. Set aside 4 of them for the D block in the next section.

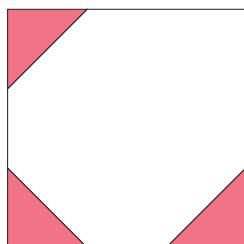


- 2 Align the top left corners of one  $9\frac{1}{2}$ " ( $12\frac{1}{2}$ ")( $18\frac{1}{2}$ " Background square and one  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " ( $4\frac{1}{2}$ ")( $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Print square, right sides together.

Sew across the marked line. Trim the extra triangle about  $\frac{1}{4}$ " outside from the seam. Press the triangle out.

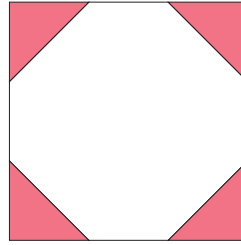


- 3 Repeat for three out of the four corners.



## Sew your D block

You need 1 D block for all sizes.



For the D block you'll need one  $9\frac{1}{2}$ " ( $12\frac{1}{2}$ ")( $18\frac{1}{2}$ " Background square and four  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " ( $4\frac{1}{2}$ ")( $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Print squares.

Follow steps 1-2 in the **Sew your C blocks** section to add corner triangles to all four corners of a  $9\frac{1}{2}$ " ( $12\frac{1}{2}$ ")( $18\frac{1}{2}$ " Background square using the four marked  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " ( $4\frac{1}{2}$ ")( $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Print squares you set aside in that section.

## Assembling your quilt top

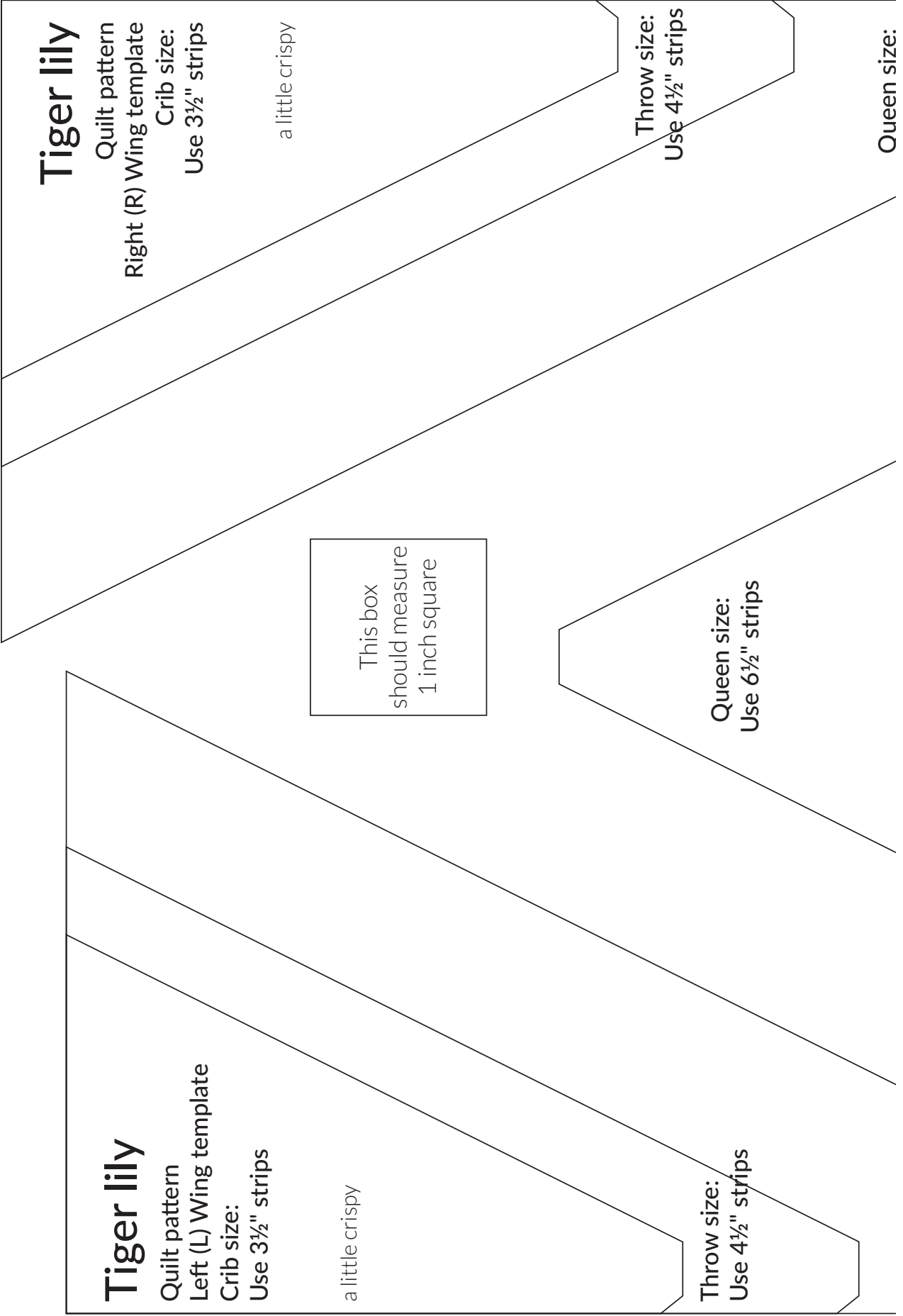
Sew the rest of your quilt top together following the assembly diagram on page 8. Press to reduce bulk and shadowing as needed.

## Quilting & finishing

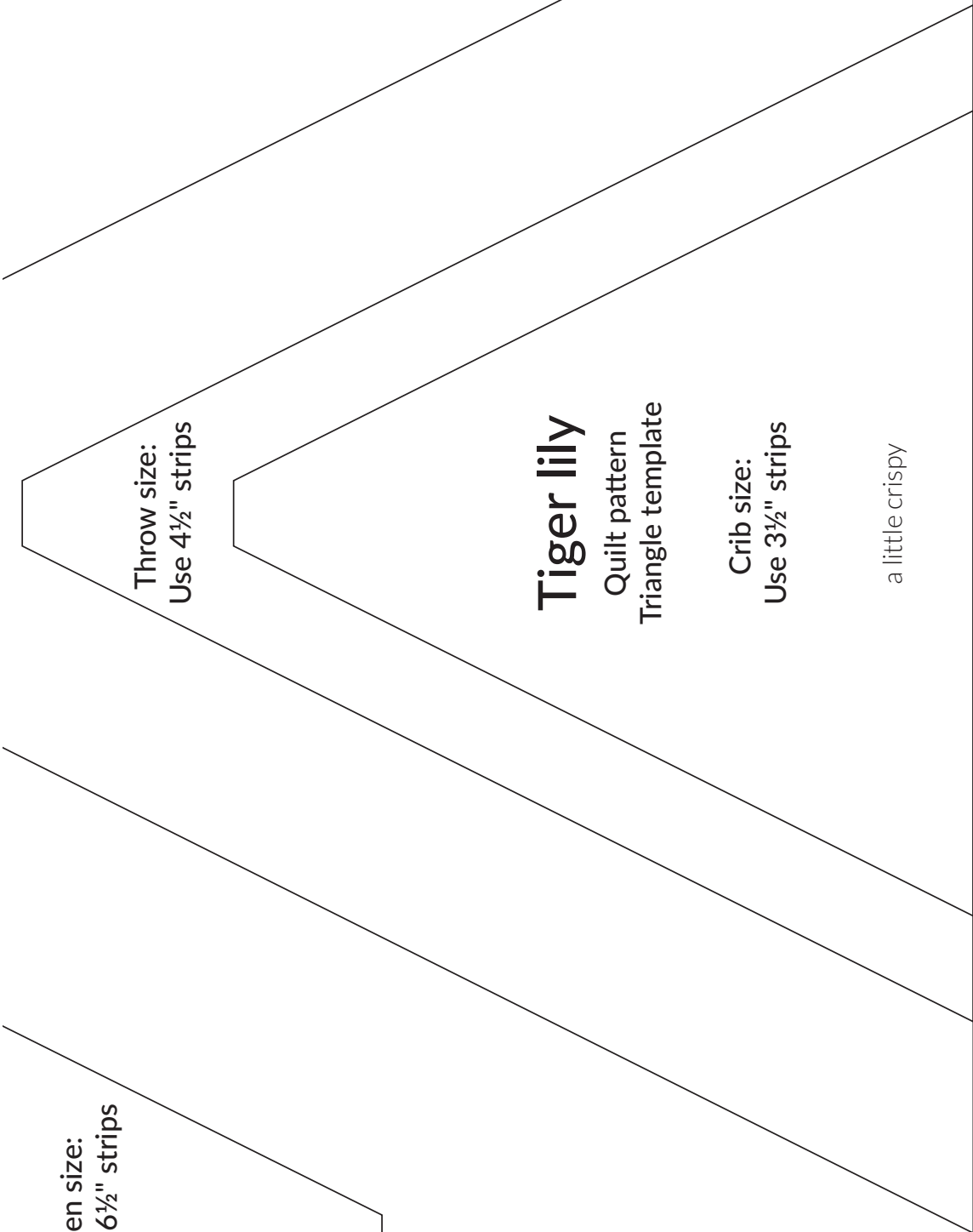
When you are done the quilt top, press it well from both sides.

Layer your well-pressed quilt top with your batting and backing and baste your quilt.

Quilt, square it off so the edges are nice and straight, and then sew on your binding. Wash and enjoy!

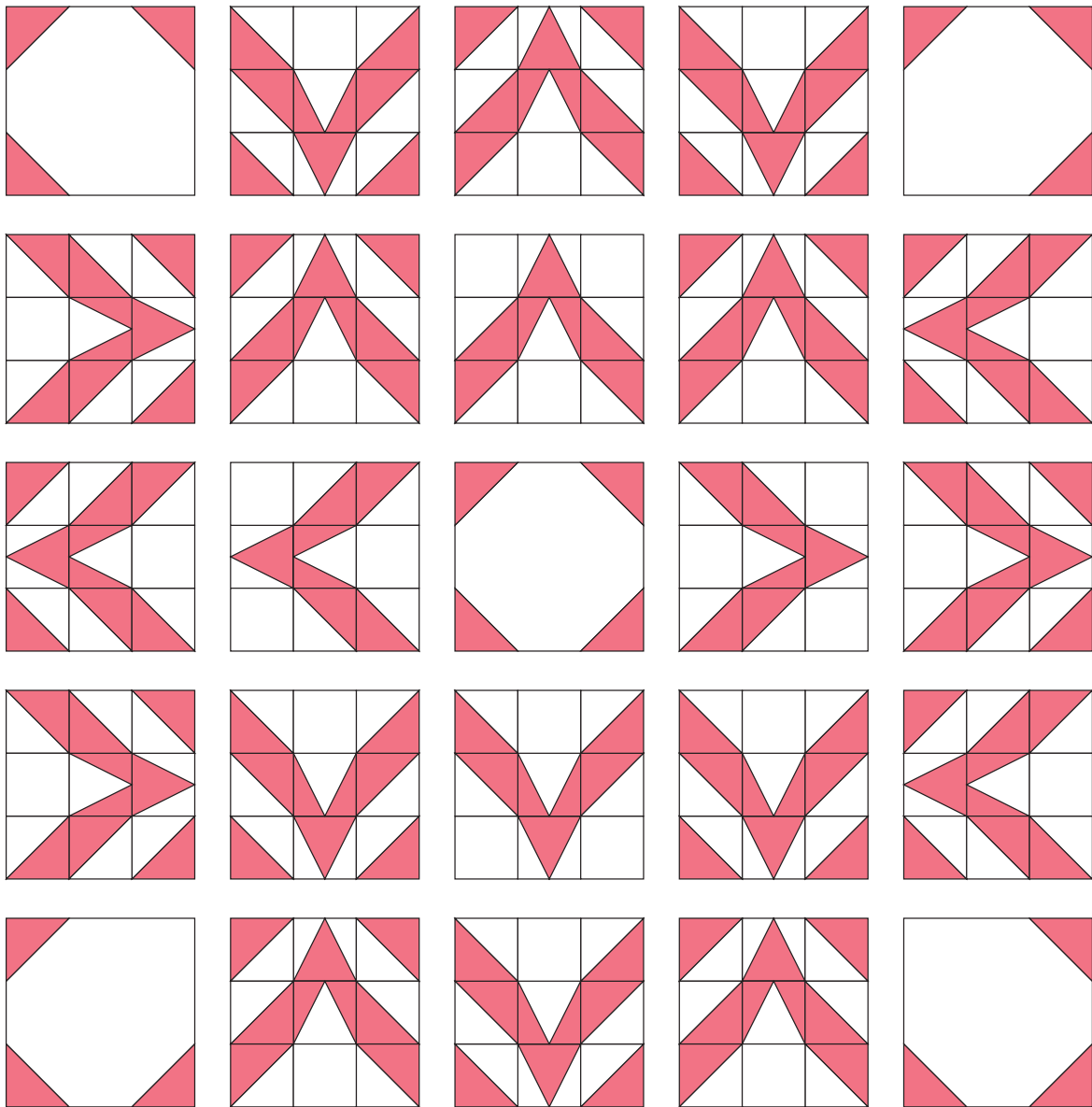

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# Assembly diagram

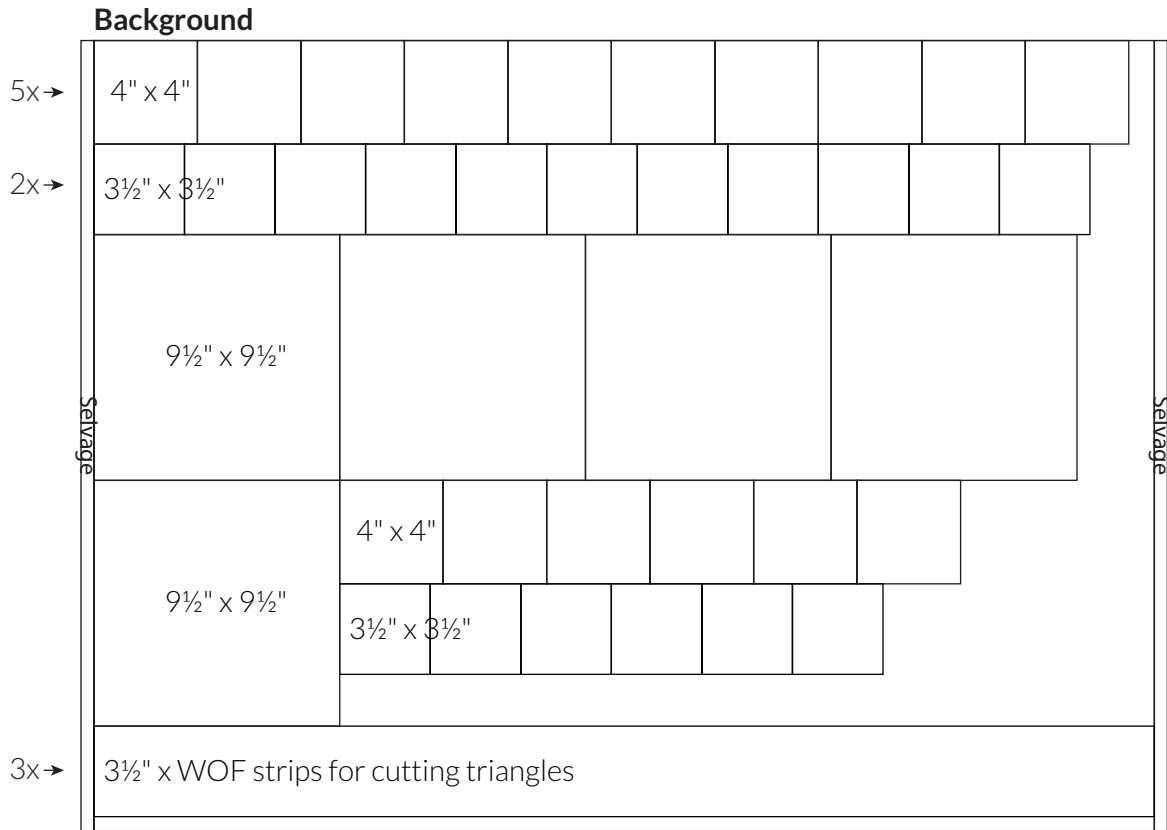
All three sizes (Crib, Throw, and Queen) have the same layout.





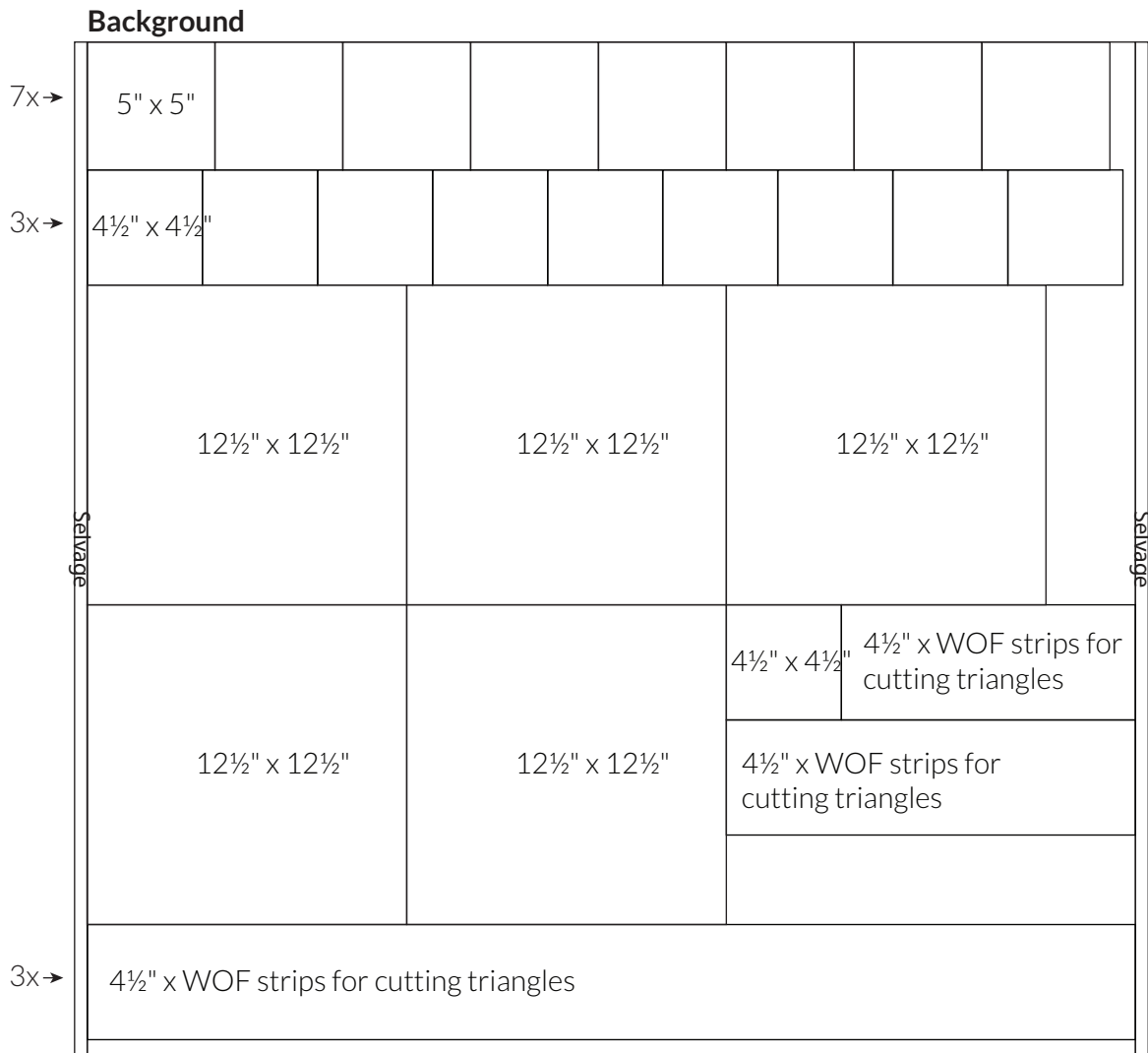
# Cutting diagram: Crib

Use the following diagrams to cut your fabric. A number and x pointing to a row means to cut that many of that row. For example: 3x means to cut three of that row.



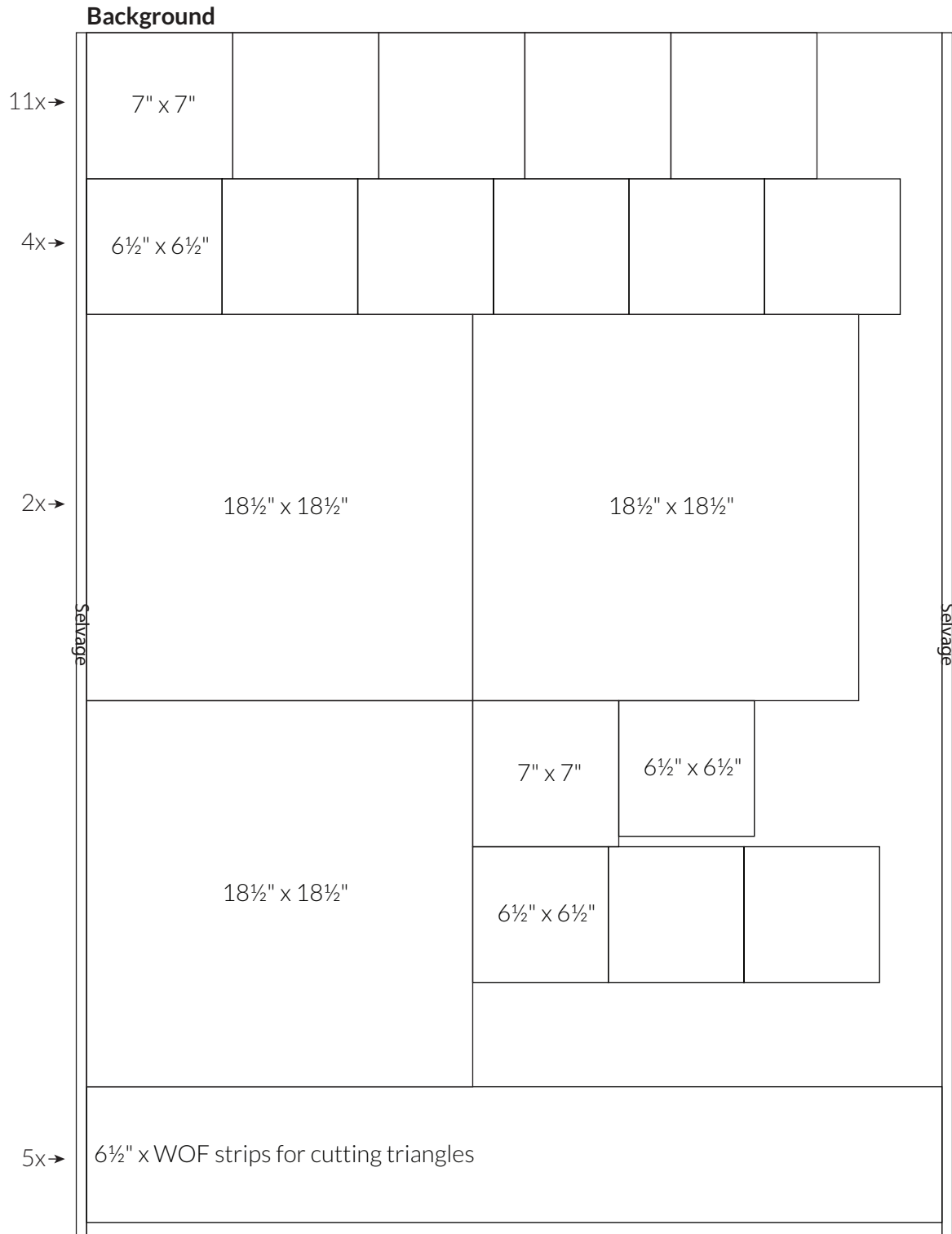
# Cutting diagram: Throw

Use the following diagrams to cut your fabric. A number and x pointing to a row means to cut that many of that row. For example: 3x means to cut three of that row.

Make this bold flower quilt by sewing only very easy components. This quilt is perfect for making a dent in your scrap basket! The crib and throw size are charm pack and layer cake friendly.

## Fabric

You will need a variety of 100% cotton quilting fabrics, 42" wide, as listed in the table below. I recommend purchasing slightly more than listed just in case.

The key to this pattern is to choose a background that contrasts very well with all of your prints. If you choose a light background, only choose medium or dark prints. Similarly, if you choose a dark background, choose only light or medium prints. Try to also choose prints that don't have the same or similar background color as the background.

Prints	Scraps, about 1¼ yards total	Scraps, about 2 yards total	Scraps, about 3½ yards total
Background	2 yards	2¾ yards	5¾ yards
Binding*	¾ yard	¾ yard	¾ yard
Backing	2¾ yards	3¾ yards	8 yards
Batting	49" x 49"	64" x 64"	94" x 94"

\*Binding amount assumes 2½" strips, cut the width of the fabric. You'll need more if you cut on the bias.



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
