Cutting

All measurements include ¼" seam allowances.

Fabric quantities are given on the back cover of this pattern.

Download and print a free coloring sheet at <https://goo.gl/vxWati>.

For this pattern, there are four groups of colors and three background fabrics. Group your prints into four categories:

- A:** Warm dark,
- B:** Warm light,
- C:** Cool dark,
- D:** Cool light.

"Warm" colors being red, orange, violet, yellow, pink, and "Cool" colors being blue and green.

The background colors are:

- E:** (cream background),
- F:** (gray background),
- G:** (dark gray cornerstones).

Cut out your fabric as listed in the table and below the table. The number of pieces to cut is in the column under the size you're making. The Block column shows to which block the pieces belong.

Piece together width of fabric (WOF) strips to create the long strips.

In addition, you will need border strips from F (and E, for the Queen only) fabric. The measurements below are slightly longer than needed. **When it is time to attach the borders, carefully measure the quilt without stretching the edge and trim the border length to exactly the length of the quilt.**

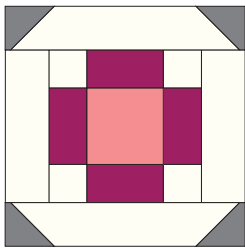
- Crib: (4 F) 2¼" x WOF
- Throw: (2 F) 2¼" x 70", (2 F) 2¼" x 74"
- Twin: (2 F) 2¼" x 74", (2 F) 2¼" x 84" (add side borders before top/bottom)
- Queen: (2 F) 2¼" x 84", (2 F) 2¼" x 88", (2 E) 2¼" x 88", (2 E) 2¼" x 92", (2 F) 2¼" x 92", (2 F) 2¼" x 96".

Sewing your blocks

This quilt consists of two alternating blocks, Block X and Block Y. Blocks X and Y are the same with different color placement. There are also two corner blocks, Corner A and Corner B.

In all illustrations, arrows indicate pressing direction. A double-headed arrow means to press open.

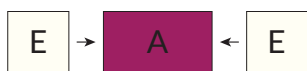
Sew Block X



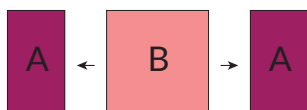
Instructions below are for one block. You will need:

- Crib: 6
- Throw: 20
- Twin: 25
- Queen: 30

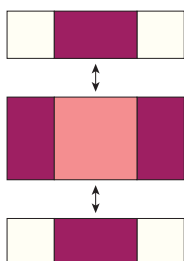
1 Sew one $2\frac{1}{4}$ " x $2\frac{1}{4}$ " E square to either side of a $2\frac{1}{4}$ " x 4" A rectangle. Make two of these components.



2 Sew one $2\frac{1}{4}$ " x 4" A rectangle to either side of a 4" x 4" B square.

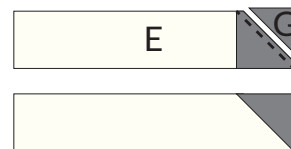


3 Sew the two components from step 1 to either side of the component from step 2.



4 Mark a diagonal line on the back of all of the $2\frac{1}{4}$ " x $2\frac{1}{4}$ " G squares. You'll use some of them for this block and others for future blocks.

5 Layer a marked G square on a $2\frac{1}{4}$ " x 11" E rectangle, right sides together, so that the two pieces line up at the right edge and the diagonal line is positioned as shown below.

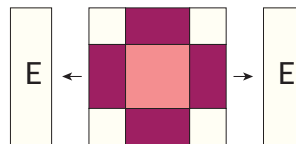


Stitch across the marked line. Trim the extra fabric from the corner $\frac{1}{4}$ " from your stitching line and press.

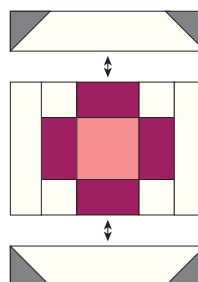
6 Repeat steps 3 and 4 once more for the other side of the E rectangle as shown below. Make two of these components.



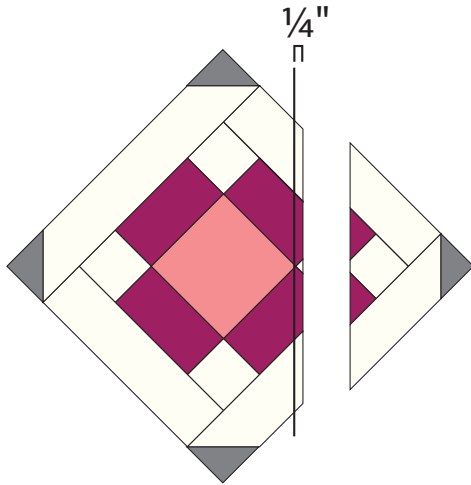
7 Sew one $2\frac{1}{4}$ " x $7\frac{1}{2}$ " E rectangle to either side of the component from step 3.



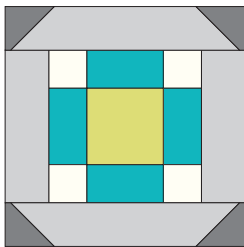
8 Sew one component from step 6 to either side of the component from step 7 as shown below.



- 9** Trim some of your blocks (Crib: 4, Throw: 8, Twin: 10, Queen: 10) so that they extend $\frac{1}{4}$ " past the line made by the corner of the B square as shown below. Line up the 45 degree line on your ruler with the outer edge of the block to make sure that the trimmed edge is straight. Save these trimmed triangles to use as setting triangles.

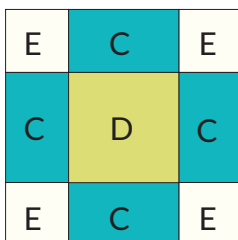


Sew Block Y



Instructions below are for one block. You will need:

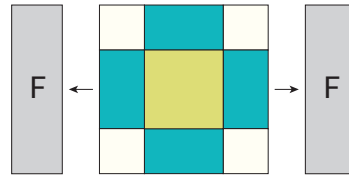
- Crib: 6
 - Throw: 20
 - Twin: 24
 - Queen: 30
- 1** Repeat steps 1-3 of the X blocks to make the center of the block as shown below.



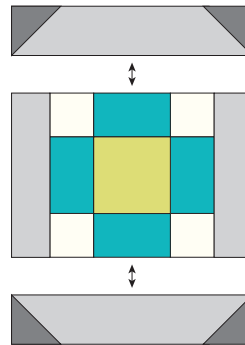
- 2** Repeat step 5-6 of the X blocks using F rectangles and G squares. Make two of these components.



- 3** Sew one $2\frac{1}{4}$ " x $7\frac{1}{2}$ " F rectangle to either side of the component from step 1.

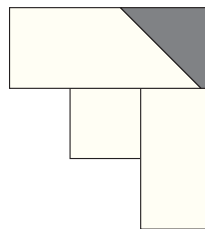


- 4** Sew one component from step 2 to either side of the component from step 3 as shown below.



- 5** Repeat step 9 of the X blocks and trim some of your Y blocks (Crib: 4, Throw: 8, Twin: 8, Queen: 10) $\frac{1}{4}$ " past the line made by the corner of the D square. Save these trimmed triangles for setting triangles.

Sew Corner A



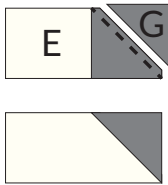
Instructions below are for one block.

You will need:

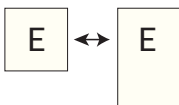
- Crib: 2
- Throw: 2
- Twin: 0
- Queen: 2

- 1 Layer one $2\frac{1}{4}$ " x $2\frac{1}{4}$ " G square on top of a $2\frac{1}{4}$ " x 5" E rectangle, right sides together, as shown below.

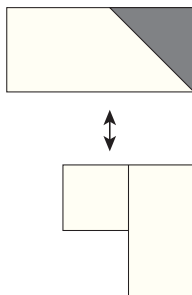
Stitch across the marked line. Trim the extra fabric from the corner $\frac{1}{4}$ " from your stitching line and press.



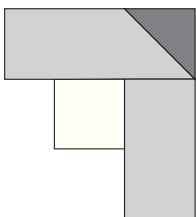
- 2 Sew together one $2\frac{1}{4}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " E rectangle and a $2\frac{1}{4}$ " x $2\frac{1}{4}$ " E square as shown.



- 3 Sew together the components from steps 1 and 2 as shown below.



Sew Corner B

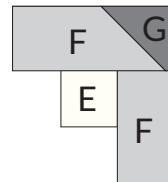


Instructions below are for one block.

You will need:

- Crib: 2
- Throw: 2
- Twin: 4
- Queen: 2

- 1 Repeat the instructions from **Sew Corner A** using F rectangles instead of E rectangles as shown below.



Assembly

Lay out your quilt as shown in the layout diagram and sew together in diagonal rows. Use the trimmed triangles or corner squares as needed at the beginning and end of each row. Trim the excess off of the setting triangles and corner blocks so that the quilt edges are straight.

The border length measurements in the cutting directions are slightly longer than needed. **When it is time to attach the borders, carefully measure the quilt without stretching the edge and cut the border length to exactly the length of the quilt.**

Pin the borders to the outer edges and sew them first to the sides, then to the top and bottom of the quilt. All of the quilt edges have bias edges, so be very careful not to stretch the edge while you are sewing.

Quilting & finishing

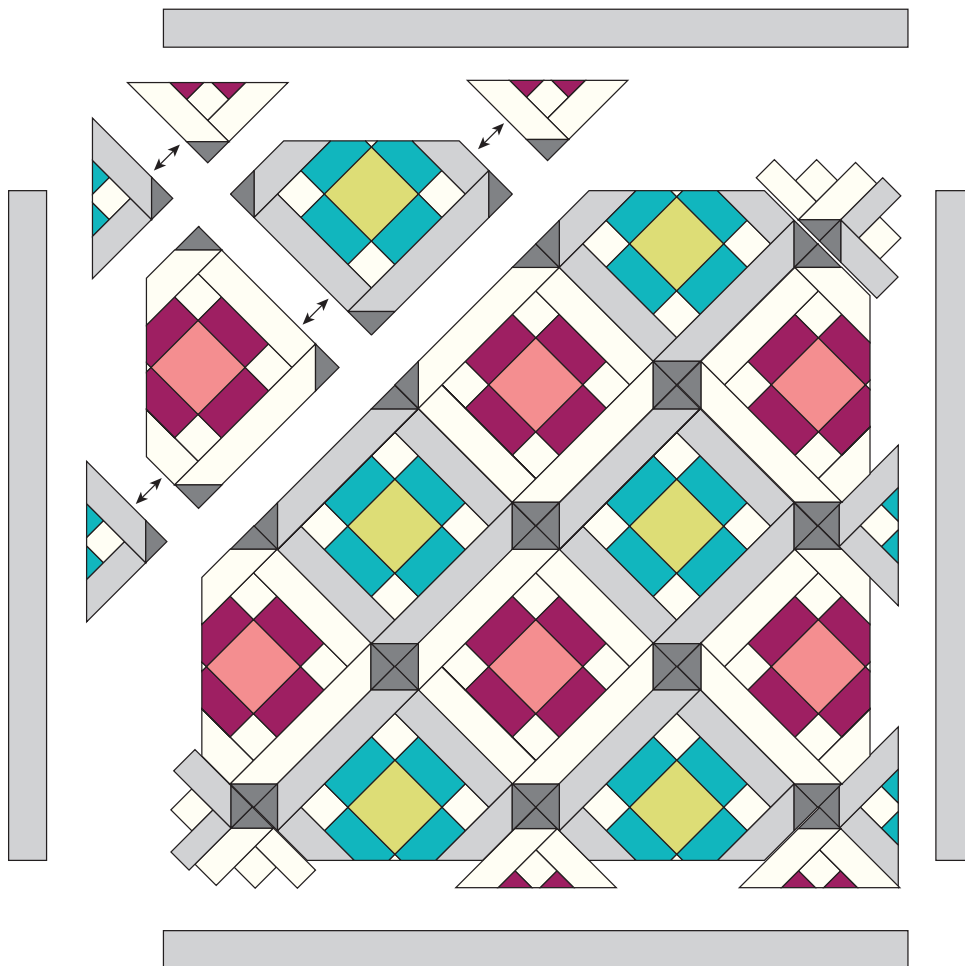
When you are done the quilt top, press it well from both sides.

Layer your well-pressed quilt top with your batting and backing and baste.

Quilt, square it off so the edges are nice and straight, and then sew on your binding. Wash and enjoy!

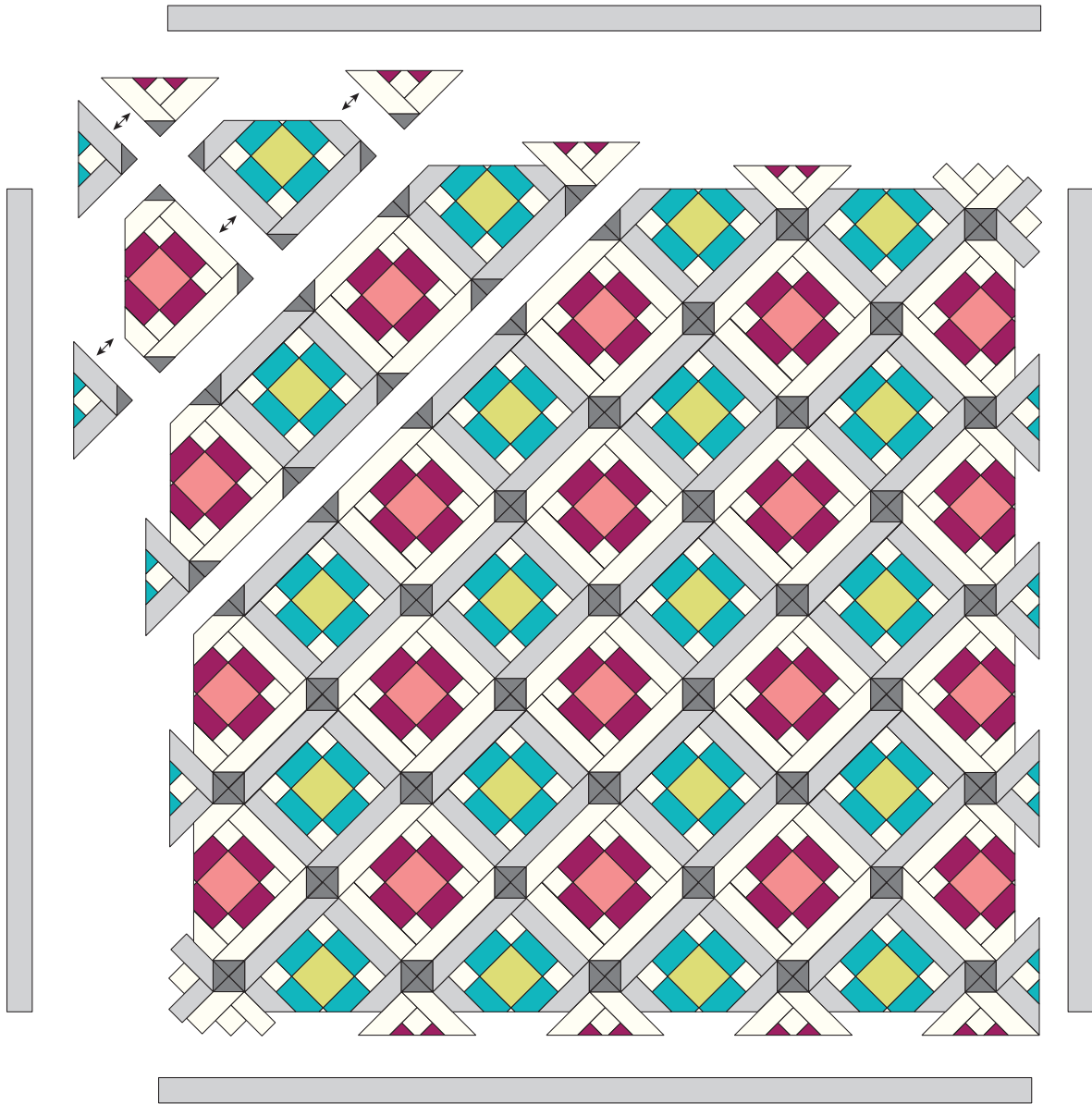
Assembly diagram: Crib

Add borders to the top and sides after assembling and trimming the center area as shown below. Make sure to pin the borders carefully to keep them nice and flat. The border length measurements in the cutting directions are slightly longer than needed. *When it is time to attach the borders, carefully measure the quilt without stretching the edge and cut the border length to exactly the length of the quilt.*



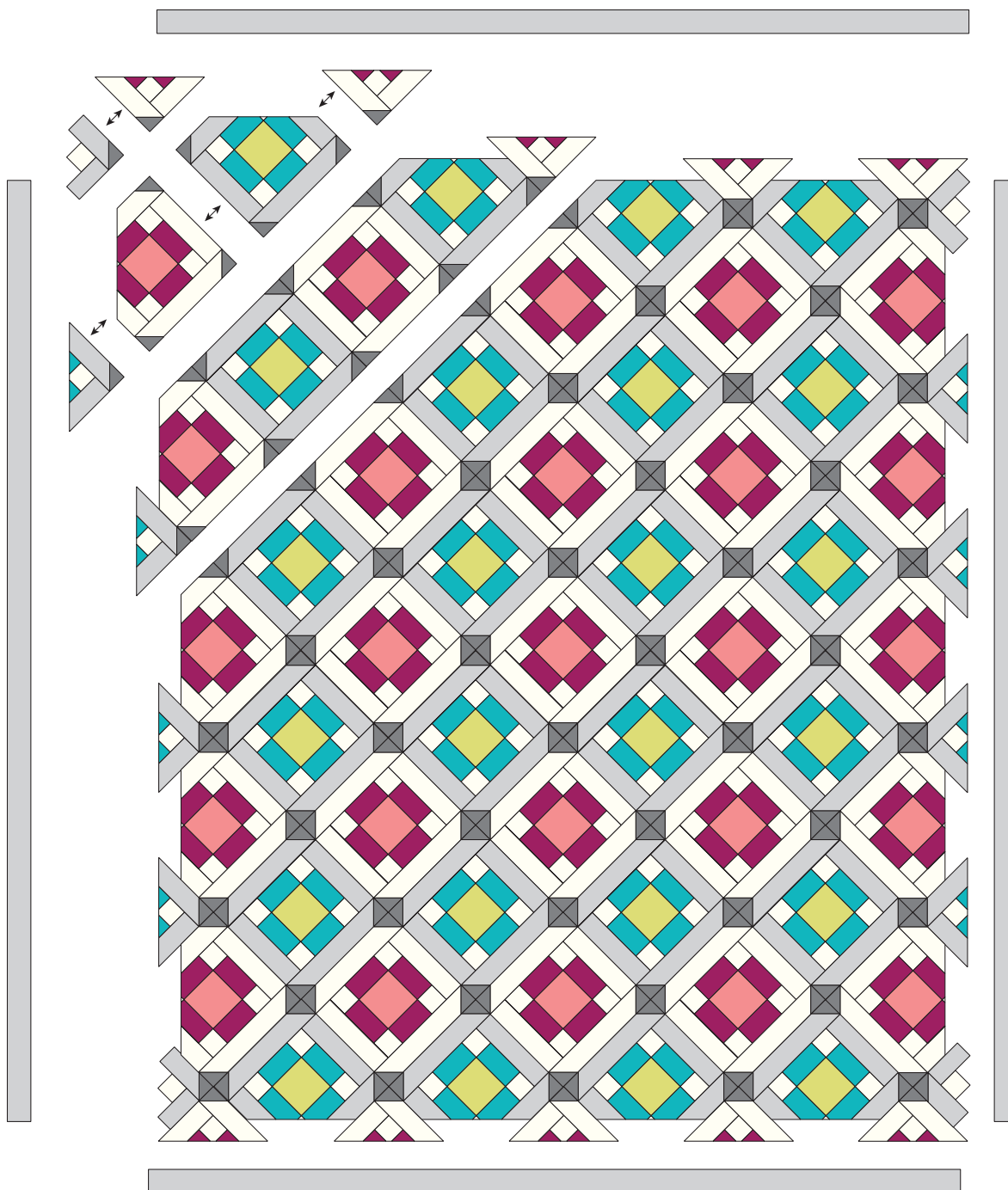
Assembly diagram: Throw

Add borders to the top and sides after assembling and trimming the center area as shown below. Make sure to pin the borders carefully to keep them nice and flat. The border length measurements in the cutting directions are slightly longer than needed. *When it is time to attach the borders, carefully measure the quilt without stretching the edge and cut the border length to exactly the length of the quilt.*



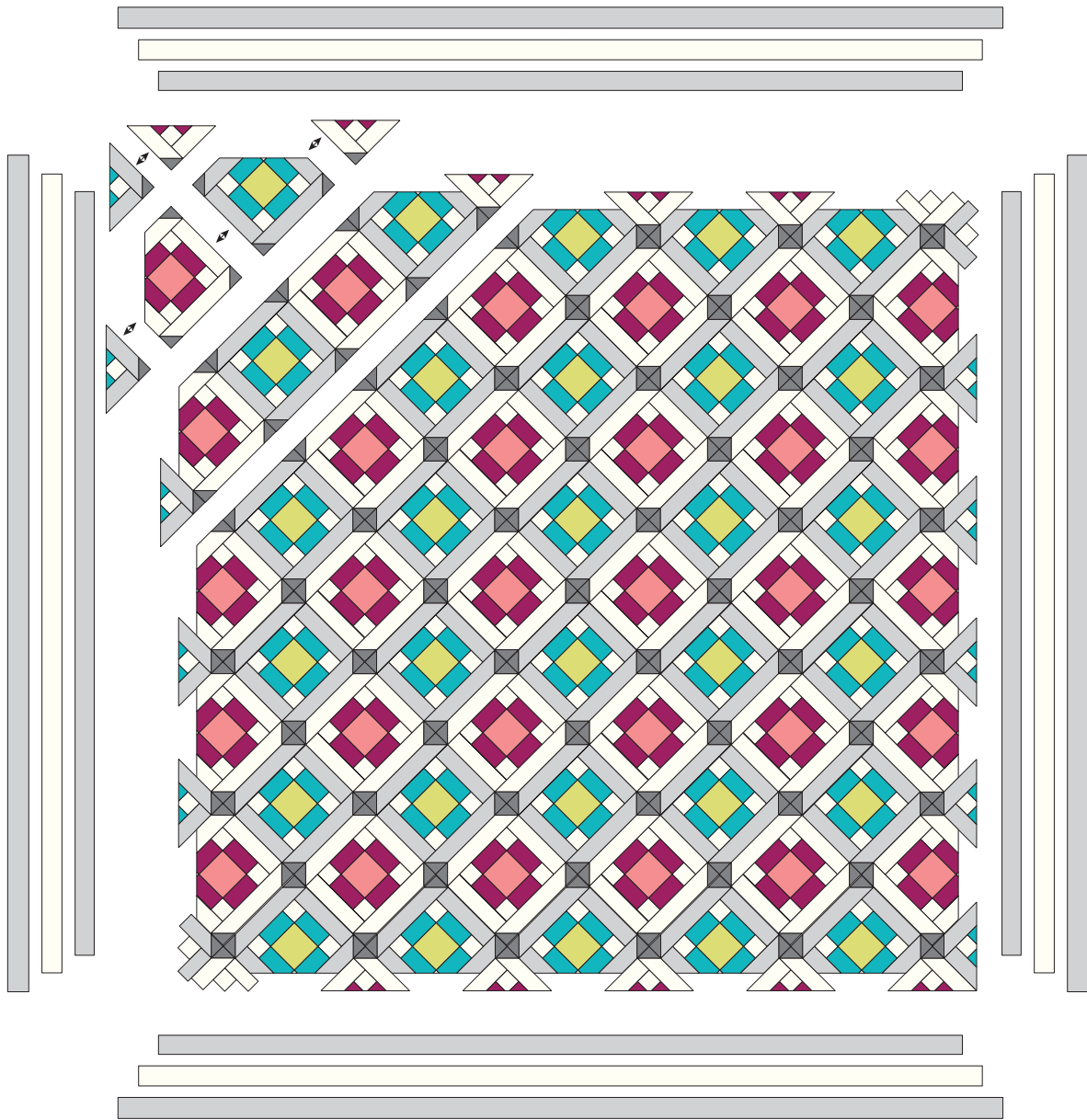
Assembly diagram: Twin

Add borders to the top and sides after assembling and trimming the center area as shown below. Make sure to pin the borders carefully to keep them nice and flat. The border length measurements in the cutting directions are slightly longer than needed. *When it is time to attach the borders, carefully measure the quilt without stretching the edge and cut the border length to exactly the length of the quilt.*



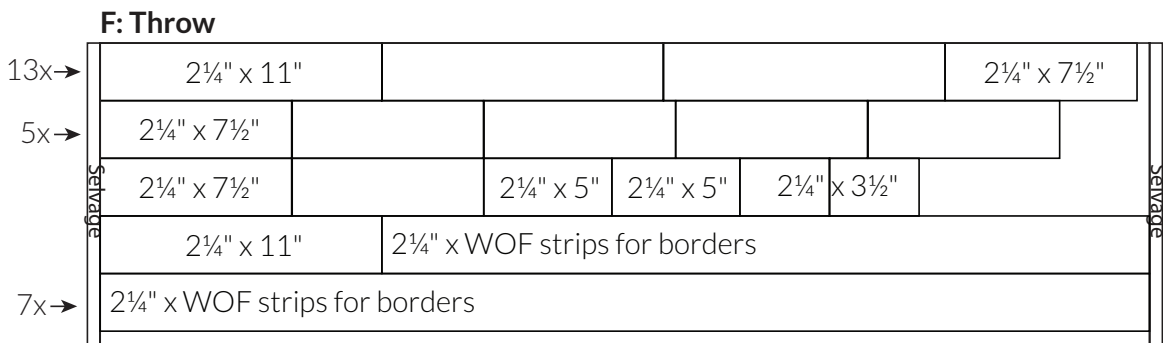
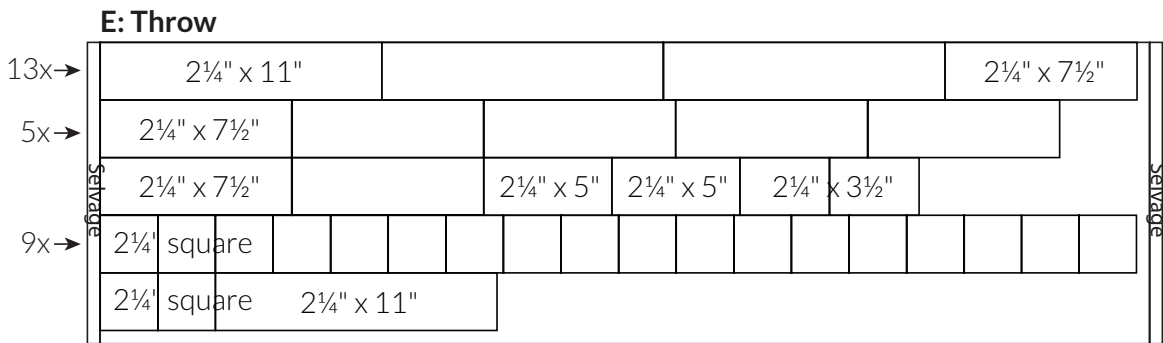
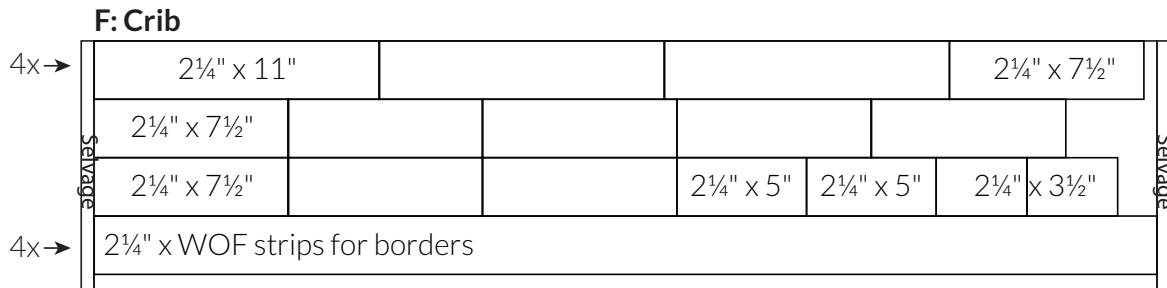
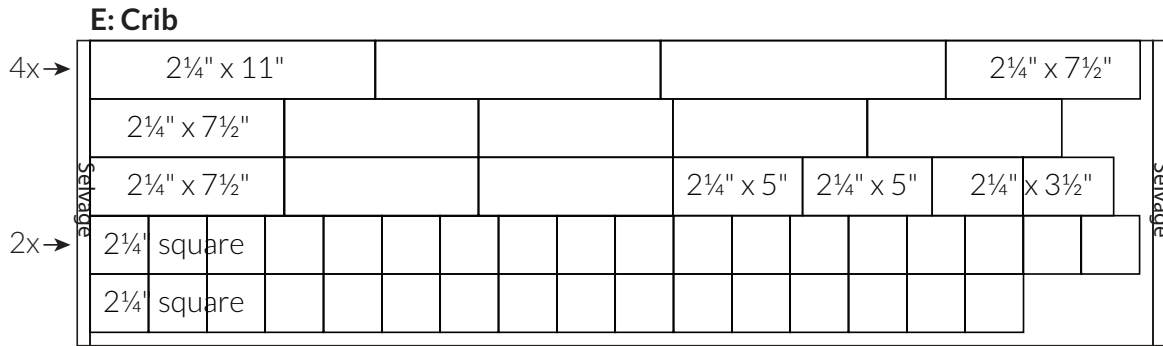
Assembly diagram: Queen

Add borders to the top and sides after assembling and trimming the center area as shown below. Make sure to pin the borders carefully to keep them nice and flat. The border length measurements in the cutting directions are slightly longer than needed. *When it is time to attach the borders, carefully measure the quilt without stretching the edge and cut the border length to exactly the length of the quilt.*



Cutting diagrams

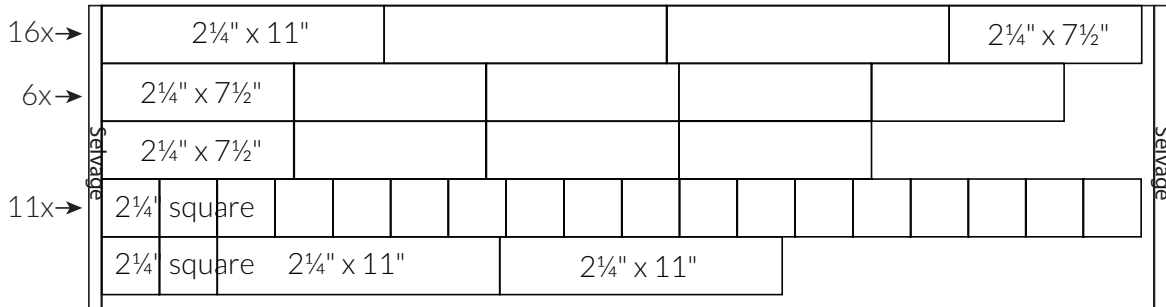
Use the following diagrams to cut your fabric. A number and x pointing to a row means to cut that many of that row. For example: 3x means to cut three of that row.



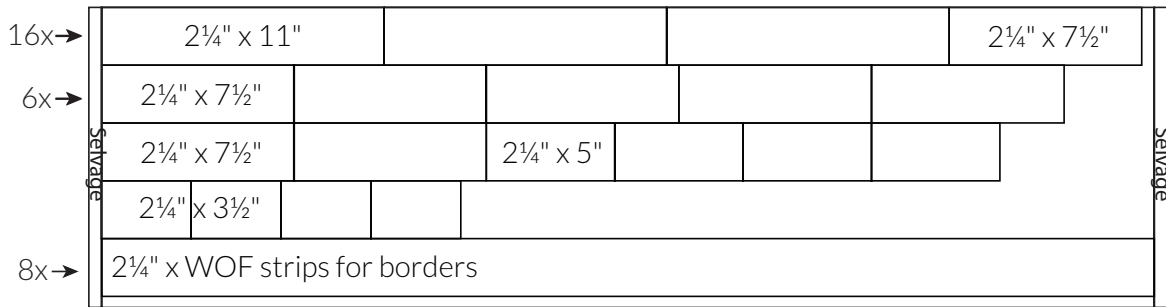

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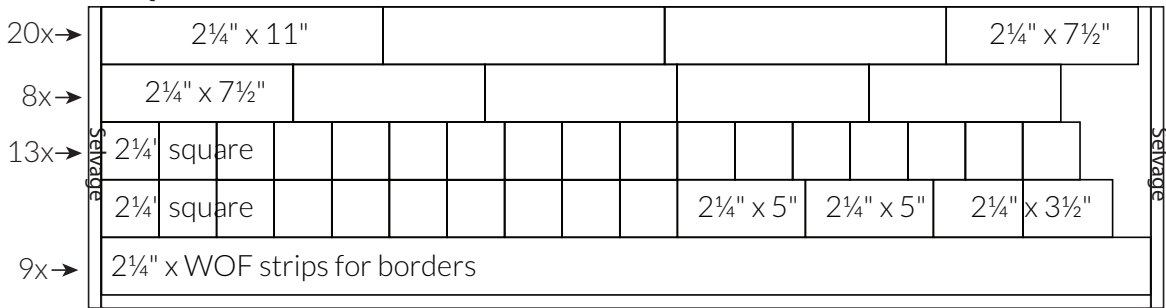

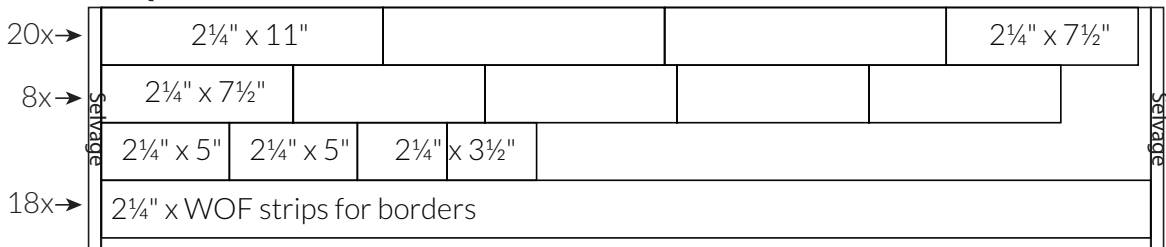
F: Twin

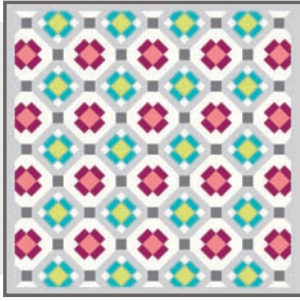


E: Queen

Fabric

You will need a variety of 100% cotton quilting fabrics, 42" wide, as listed in the table below. I recommend purchasing slightly more than listed just in case. Choose a solid or a non-busy print for your backgrounds for contrast.

A through D are colorful prints or solids: two groups of fabric, warm and cool, that each have lights and darks. Within each group you can mix and match scraps of a similar value or color. For background fabrics I used E: Kona Oyster, F: Kona Ash, and G: Kona Mushroom.

**These amounts assume that some long strips are pieced together.

***Binding amount assumes 2 1/2" strips, cut the width of the fabric. You'll need more if you cut on the bias.
